Whereas, There are 317 new names of fallen heroes being added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial this spring, including 153 officers killed in 2010 and 164 officers killed in previous years; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare May 15-21, 2011, as Police Week in the state of Michigan.
