A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 43506 (MCL 324.43506), as amended by 2006 PA 282.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs.

Rep. O'Brien moved that the House adjourn.

The motion prevailed, the time being 2:35 p.m.
