**(A) THE DATE AND TIME THE EVENT WILL BE HELD.**

**(B) THE LOCATION OF THE EVENT.****(C) EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:**

**(i) A STATEMENT THAT THE MICRO BREWER, BREWPUB, OR ON-PREMISES LICENSEE ACKNOWLEDGES THAT IT IS NOT IN CONTROL OF AN UNREGULATED ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE AT ITS ESTABLISHMENT AND AGREES TO ASSUME LIABILITY UNDER SECTION 801(3) FOR THE EVENT.**

**(ii) PROOF THAT THE HOME BREWERS OR HOME BREWERS CLUB HAS OBTAINED A BOND OR LIABILITY INSURANCE EQUAL TO THAT REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 803(1)."** and renumbering the remaining subsection.
