“DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

Sec. 301. From the funds appropriated to the department of human services for indigent burial in 2009 PA 129, the department of human services may work with funeral directors to establish a regional or statewide pilot program that would include the following elements. The department’s pilot project shall provide funding only for the direct cremation of bodies of indigent persons that are not claimed by a person having the right to control the disposition of the body. The department may select through competitive bidding funeral directors in each county or region of the state to supervise the disposition of the unclaimed bodies. Until contracts based upon such competitive bidding are entered into, the payment to a funeral director for these services shall be \$800.00 plus mileage reimbursement for transportation costs at the standard rate established by the department of management and budget for travel reimbursement for non-state vehicles plus the cost of the cremation permit. The department may deviate from the payment limits established in section 613(1) of 2009 PA 129 in making payments under the pilot program. The department shall forward a copy of the pilot program to the senate and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on human services.”.

While it’s difficult to vote against taking ARRA money, this is exactly how additional pork is added to bills at the last minute. This should have been vetted in committee.”

A bill to amend 1933 PA 167, entitled "General sales tax act," by amending section 25 (MCL 205.75), as amended by 2008 PA 361.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 317, entitled "Worker's disability compensation act of 1969," by amending section 405 (MCL 418.405), as amended by 1980 PA 457.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 300, entitled "The public school employees retirement act of 1979," by amending section 91 (MCL 38.1391), as amended by 2007 PA 110.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 339, entitled "An act to authorize the establishment of a system of retiring allowances for employes of public libraries now existing or which may hereafter be established in incorporated cities of 250,000 population or more," by amending section 2 (MCL 38.702).

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Public Employee Health Care Reform.

A bill to amend 1967 PA 156, entitled "Optional retirement act of 1967," by amending section 4 (MCL 38.384).

House Bill No. 5697, entitled

A bill to amend 1851 PA 156, entitled "An act to define the powers and duties of the county boards of commissioners of the several counties, and to confer upon them certain local, administrative and legislative powers; and to prescribe penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act," by amending section 12a (MCL 46.12a), as amended by 2003 PA 219.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Public Employee Health Care Reform.
