A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 602b (MCL 257.602b), as amended by 2016 PA 332.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 602b. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a

- 3 wireless 2-way communication digitally communicate using a mobile

 2 subsection does not apply to a person operating a commercial
 3 vehicle.not a commercial motor vehicle.
 - (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a person who is using a mobile electronic device to do any of the following:
 - (a) Carry out official duties as a police officer, law enforcement official, member of a paid or volunteer fire department, or operator of an emergency vehicle.
 - (b) Respond to a public utility emergency, if the response is by a public utility employee or contractor acting within the scope of that person's employment.
 - (c) Report or avert an emergency, including the use of text messaging to contact a 9-1-1 service system.
 - (d) Operate or program the operation of an automated motor vehicle while testing or operating the automated motor vehicle without a human operator.
 - shall not read, manually type, or send a text message on a wireless 2-way communication digitally communicate using a mobile electronic device that is located in the person's hand or in the person's lap, including a wireless telephone used in cellular telephone service or personal communication service, while operating a commercial motor vehicle or a school bus. on a highway or street in this state. As used in this subsection, a wireless 2-way communication device does not include a global positioning or navigation system that is affixed to the commercial motor vehicle or school bus.
 - (4) (3)—Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person shall not use a hand-held mobile telephone to conduct a voice communication while operating a commercial motor vehicle or a

- 2 due to traffic, a traffic control device, or other momentary
- 3 delays. This subsection does not apply if the operator of the
- 4 commercial vehicle or school bus has moved the vehicle to the side

- 6 vehicle can safely remain stationary. As used in this subsection,
- 7 "mobile telephone" does not include a 2-way radio service or
- 8 citizens band radio service. means that term as defined in 49 CFR
- 9 390.5. As used in this subsection, "use a hand-held mobile
- 10 telephone" means 1 or more of the following:
- 11 (a) Using at least 1 hand to hold a mobile telephone to
 12 conduct a voice communication.
- (b) Dialing or answering a mobile telephone by pressing morethan a single button.
- 15 (c) Reaching for a mobile telephone in a manner that requires
 16 a driver to maneuver so that he or she is no longer in a seated
 17 driving position, restrained by a seat belt that is installed as
 18 required by 49 CFR 393.93 and adjusted in accordance with the
 19 vehicle manufacturer's instructions.
 - (5) (4)—Subsections (1), (2), and (3) and (4) do not apply to an individual who is using a mobile electronic device or a device described in subsection (1) or (3)—(4) to do any of the following:
- (a) Report a traffic accident, medical emergency, or seriousroad hazard.
- (b) Report a situation in which the person believes his or herpersonal safety is in jeopardy.
- (c) Report or avert the perpetration or potential perpetrationof a criminal act against the individual or another person.

- enforcement official, member of a paid or volunteer firedepartment, or operator of an emergency vehicle.
- 3 (e) Operate or program the operation of an automated motor
 4 vehicle while testing or operating the automated motor vehicle
 5 without a human operator.
- 6 (6) (5)—Subsection (1) does not apply to a person using an on-7 demand automated motor vehicle network.
- **11** (a) For a first violation, \$100.00.
- 12 (b) For a second or subsequent violation, \$200.00.
- 13 (8) (7)—This section supersedes all local ordinances
 14 regulating the use of a communications device while operating a
 15 motor vehicle in motion on a highway or street, except that a unit
 16 of local government may adopt an ordinance or enforce an existing
 17 ordinance substantially corresponding to this section.
 - (9) A law enforcement officer enforcing this section may treat a violation of this section as the primary or sole reason for issuing a citation to a driver. A law enforcement officer shall not search a motor vehicle or the driver or passenger in the motor vehicle solely because of a violation of this section.
 - (10) This section does not apply to the use of radio equipment that is allowed under 47 CFR 90 or 47 CFR 97.
 - (11) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Digitally communicate" means manual interaction on a mobile electronic device limited to writing, sending, or reading a text-based communication, mobile gaming, viewing or posting on a social networking site, or viewing, capturing, recording, or

- 1 transmitting a video or photo on a mobile electronic device.
- 2 Digitally communicate does not include hands-free interaction,
- 3 voice communication, or a navigation function.
- 4 (b) "Mobile electronic device" means a mobile telephone as
- 5 that term is defined in 49 CFR 390.5. Mobile electronic device also
- 6 includes a computer but does not include a watch or a global
- 7 positioning or navigation system affixed to a motor vehicle.
- 8 (c) "Operate" means to drive a motor vehicle on a public way,
- 9 street, road, or highway in this state, including operation while
- 10 temporarily stationary for not longer than 5 minutes because of
- 11 traffic, road conditions, a traffic light, or a stop sign. Operate
- 12 does not include a motor vehicle that is lawfully parked.
- 13 (d) "Social networking site" means any web-based service that
- 14 allows individuals to construct a profile within a founded system
- 15 and communicate with other users of the site for social or
- 16 amusement purposes.
