SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4689

A bill to amend 1937 PA 306, entitled

"An act to promote the safety, welfare, and educational interests of the people of the state of Michigan by regulating the construction, reconstruction, and remodeling of certain public or private school buildings or additions to such buildings, by regulating the construction, reconstruction, and remodeling of buildings leased or acquired for school purposes, and to define the class of buildings affected by this act; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; to prescribe penalties for the violation of this act; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending the title and section 5a (MCL 388.855a), the title as amended by 2002 PA 628 and section 5a as amended by 2006 PA 199, and by adding section 1d.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE





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An act to promote the safety, welfare, and educational 1 2 interests of the people of the state of Michigan this state by regulating the construction, reconstruction, and remodeling of, and 3 the installation of certain security devices at, certain public or 4 private school buildings or additions to such those buildings - and 5 6 by regulating the construction, reconstruction, and remodeling of, 7 and the installation of certain security devices at, buildings 8 leased or acquired for school purposes; , and to define the class 9 of buildings affected by this act; to prescribe the powers and 10 duties of certain state agencies and officials; to prescribe 11 penalties for the violation of this act; and to repeal acts and 12 parts of acts.

Sec. 1d. (1) A temporary door locking device or system may be installed pursuant to the requirements under this section.

15 (2) All of the following apply to the installation and use of16 a temporary door locking device or system in a school building:

(a) The device or system is portable and will not be
permanently affixed to the door. Individual parts of the locking
assembly of the device or system, including, but not limited to,
bolts, stops, brackets, and pins, that do not prevent normal
ingress and egress through the door may be permanently mounted on a
labeled fire door assembly.

(b) The locking means is capable of being engaged withoutopening the door.

(c) The door is capable of being unlocked and opened fromoutside the room with a required tool or key.

27 (d) The locking means does not modify the door closure, panic28 hardware, or fire exit hardware.

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(e) The device or system may be disengaged by an individual on



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the interior side of the door without the use of a key or special
 tool.

3 (f) Installation and operation of the fixed elements of the
4 device or system is in compliance with 1966 PA 1, MCL 125.1351 to
5 125.1356.

6 (g) A properly trained firefighter, law enforcement officer,
7 or school official is able to release the locking device or system
8 from the outside.

9 (h) The device or system may provide notification of its 10 location and placement in the event of a lockdown.

(i) The device or system must not be installed in a room with a capacity of more than 50 people or on doors leading outside the building from a corridor.

14 (j) The device or system must be installed per the15 installation instructions submitted under subsection (3)(a).

16 (k) Any fasteners or through-bolt-penetrations to a labeled17 fire door assembly must be made of steel.

18 (l) Holes, bolts, or fasteners made or used to install a device
19 or system must be the same as stated in the installation
20 instructions submitted under subsection (3)(a).

(3) The administrative authority of the school building shalldo all of the following:

(a) Before installing the device or system in the school
building, submit to the enforcing agency drawings, diagrams, and
installation instructions for plan review, obtain plan review
approval, and obtain a permit for installation as provided in the
Stille-DeRossett-Hale single state construction code act, 1972 PA
230, MCL 125.1501 to 125.1531, and the fire prevention code, 1941
PA 207, MCL 29.1 to 29.33, and notify the local fire department and



the law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over the building
 of the intended installation or use.

3 (b) Before using the device or system in the school building, 4 notify the enforcing agency that the device or system is ready for 5 inspection and receive written approval from the enforcing agency 6 that the device or system is approved for use.

7 (c) In the school building where the device or system is
8 installed or being used, provide in-service training to staff
9 members working in the building on the use of the device or system.
10 The administrative authority shall maintain on file a record
11 verifying this training.

(d) Ensure that the device or system is engaged for only a 12 13 finite period of time, as determined by the administrative 14 authority of the school building in accordance with, beginning 15 January 1, 2020, an emergency operations plan adopted under section 16 1308b of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1308b. The 17 emergency operations plan described in this subparagraph must 18 include a description of the installation and use of the temporary 19 locking devices or systems used by the administrative authority.

20 (4) For purposes of this act, the installation of a temporary
21 door locking device or system is not considered construction,
22 reconstruction, or remodeling of a school building or addition to a
23 school building.

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(5) As used in this section:

(a) "Administrative authority of a school building" or
"administrative authority" means the superintendent, principal
chief administrative officer, or other person having supervisory
authority of a school building.

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(b) "Department" means the department of licensing and



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1 regulatory affairs.

2 (c) "Enforcing agency" means that term as defined in section
3 2a of the Stille-DeRossett-Hale single state construction code act,
4 1972 PA 230, MCL 125.1502a.

5 (d) "Panic hardware" means fire door hardware, handles, or
6 push bars that allow for the opening of the door with a single
7 movement.

8 (e) "Temporary door locking device or system" or "device or 9 system" means an anchoring mechanism or system installed on the 10 interior side of a door that, when engaged, secures the door 11 against forced entry.

Sec. 5a. (1) Except as provided in this section, this act does not apply to 1-story school buildings, to 1-story additions to school buildings, or to the construction, reconstruction, or remodeling of a school building if the total cost of construction, reconstruction, or remodeling is less than \$15,000.00.

17 (2) Section 1(a) 1(1) (a) applies to the construction of all 18 school buildings and additions to school buildings regardless of 19 the number of stories of the buildings or additions if the total 20 cost of construction exceeds \$15,000.00.

21 (3) Section 1(d) 1(1)(d) applies to the construction of all
22 school buildings and additions to school buildings of 1 or more
23 stories regardless of the cost of construction.

(4) This act applies to the reconstruction of a school
building destroyed or partially destroyed by fire, windstorm, or
other catastrophe if more than 50% of the entire building is
destroyed. The bureau of fire services created in section 1b of the
fire prevention code, 1941 PA 207, MCL 29.1b, acting jointly with
the superintendent of public instruction, may require that the



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damaged portion or the remaining portion of the building, or both,
 be remodeled or reconstructed in accordance with this act.

3 (5) This act applies to the remodeling of existing school4 buildings and other buildings to be used for school purposes.

5 (6) An existing building or part of an existing building,
6 regardless of the number of stories or the cost to the school
7 district of the building, that has not been used as a school
8 building shall not be used as a school building unless it is
9 approved by the superintendent of public instruction and the bureau
10 of fire services.

(7) If the construction, reconstruction, or remodeling of a school building costs less than \$15,000.00, it is not necessary to employ a registered architect or engineer, but the plans for the building shall must be submitted to the bureau of fire services and to the superintendent of public instruction or the superintendent's authorized agent for criticism, suggestions, and approval.

(8) A temporary door locking device or system, as described in
section 1d, may be installed in any school building or addition to
a school building, regardless of the number of stories of the
building or addition, or as a component in the construction,
reconstruction, or remodeling of a school building or addition to a
school building regardless of the costs of that construction,
reconstruction, or remodeling.

24 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days25 after the date it is enacted into law.
