## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 127

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 7303a (MCL 333.7303a), as amended by 2018 PA 101.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 7303a. (1) A prescriber who holds a controlled substances license may administer or dispense a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 without a separate controlled substances license for those activities.
- 5 (2) Except as otherwise provided in rules promulgated under 6 section 16204e and for a patient who is under the care of a hospice 7 licensed under article 17, beginning March 31, 2019 or, if rules 8 are promulgated under section 16204e before March 31, 2019, on the





- 1 date on which rules are promulgated under section 16204e, a
- 2 licensed prescriber shall not prescribe a controlled substance
- 3 listed in schedules 2 to 5 unless the prescriber is in a bona fide
- 4 prescriber-patient relationship with the patient for whom the
- 5 controlled substance is being prescribed. Except as otherwise
- 6 provided in this subsection, if a licensed prescriber prescribes a
- 7 controlled substance under this subsection, the prescriber shall
- 8 provide follow-up care to the patient to monitor the efficacy of
- 9 the use of the controlled substance as a treatment of the patient's
- 10 medical condition. If the licensed prescriber is unable to provide
- 11 follow-up care, he or she shall refer the patient to the patient's
- 12 primary care provider for follow-up care or, if the patient does
- 13 not have a primary care provider, he or she shall refer the patient
- 14 to another licensed prescriber who is geographically accessible to
- 15 the patient for follow-up care.
- 16 (3) Before prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance to
- 17 a patient, a licensed prescriber shall ask the patient about other
- 18 controlled substances the patient may be using. The prescriber
- 19 shall record the patient's response in the patient's medical or
- 20 clinical record.
- 21 (4) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing
- 22 to a patient a controlled substance in a quantity that exceeds a 3-
- 23 day supply, a licensed prescriber shall obtain and review a report
- 24 concerning that patient from the electronic system for monitoring
- 25 schedule 2, 3, 4, and 5 controlled substances established under
- 26 section 7333a. This subsection does not apply under any of the
- 27 following circumstances:
- 28 (a) If the dispensing occurs in a hospital or freestanding
- 29 surgical outpatient facility licensed under article 17 and the

- 1 controlled substance is administered to the patient in that
- 2 hospital or facility.

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- 3 (b) If the patient is an animal as that term is defined in
  4 section 18802, the dispensing occurs in a veterinary hospital or
  5 clinic and the controlled substance is administered to the patient
  6 in that hospital or clinic.
- 7 (c) If the controlled substance is prescribed by a licensed
  8 prescriber who is a veterinarian and the controlled substance will
  9 be dispensed by a pharmacist.
  - (d) If the patient is a patient of a hospice licensed under article 17 and the licensed prescriber has obtained and reviewed a report concerning the patient from the electronic system described in this subsection at the time the patient was admitted to the hospice.
- (5) Beginning June 1, 2018, before prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance to a patient, a licensed prescriber shall register with the electronic system for monitoring schedule 2, 3, 4, and 5 controlled substances established under section 7333a.
  - (6) A licensed prescriber who dispenses controlled substances shall maintain all of the following records separately from other prescription records:
    - (a) All invoices and other acquisition records for each controlled substance acquired by the prescriber for not less than 5 years after the date the prescriber acquires the controlled substance.
- (b) A log of all controlled substances dispensed by the
  prescriber for not less than 5 years after the date the controlled
  substance is dispensed.
- 29 (c) Records of all other dispositions of controlled substances

- under the licensee's control for not less than 5 years after thedate of the disposition.
- 5 (a) When a controlled substance listed in schedules 2 to 5 is 6 administered on the order of a licensed prescriber by an individual 7 who is licensed under article 15 as a practical nurse or a 8 registered professional nurse.
- 9 (b) When methadone or a methadone congener is dispensed on the 10 order of a licensed prescriber in a methadone treatment program 11 licensed under article 6 or when a controlled substance listed in 12 schedules 2 to 5 is dispensed on the order of a licensed prescriber 13 in a hospice rendering emergency care services in a patient's home 14 as described in section 17746 by a registered professional nurse 15 licensed under article 15.
- 16 (8) As used in this section:
- - (i) The prescriber has reviewed the patient's relevant medical or clinical records and completed a full assessment of the patient's medical history and current medical condition, including a relevant medical evaluation of the patient conducted in person or through telehealth.
- 25 (ii) The prescriber has created and maintained records of the
  26 patient's condition in accordance with medically accepted
  27 standards.
- (b) "Telehealth" means that term as defined in section 16283.Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect

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- 1 unless Senate Bill No. 128 of the 100th Legislature is enacted into
- **2** law.
