SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5731

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 216, 226, 255, 301, 306, 306a, 309, 312f, 312k, 314, and 801k (MCL 257.216, 257.226, 257.255, 257.301, 257.306, 257.306a, 257.309, 257.312f, 257.312k, 257.314, and 257.801k), as amended by 2020 PA 241.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 216. (1) Every motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, and pole trailer, when driven or moved on a street or highway, is subject to the registration and certificate of title provisions of this act except the following:
- 5 (a) A vehicle driven or moved on a street or highway in6 conformance with the provisions of this act relating to



- 1 manufacturers, transporters, dealers, or nonresidents.
- 2 (b) A vehicle that is driven or moved on a street or highway
 3 only for the purpose of crossing that street or highway from 1
 4 property to another.
 - (c) An implement of husbandry.
- 6 (d) Special mobile equipment. The secretary of state may issue
 7 a special registration to an individual, partnership, corporation,
 8 or association not licensed as a dealer that pays the required fee,
 9 to identify special mobile equipment that is driven or moved on a
 street or highway.
 - (e) A vehicle that is propelled exclusively by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires though not operated on rails.
- 13 (f) Any vehicle subject to registration, but owned by the 14 government of the United States.
- (g) A certificate of title is not required for a trailer,semitrailer, or pole trailer that weighs less than 2,500 pounds.
 - (h) A vehicle driven or moved on a street or highway, by the most direct route, only for the purpose of securing a scale weight receipt from a weighmaster for purposes of section 801 or obtaining a vehicle inspection by a law enforcement agency before titling or registration of that vehicle.
 - (i) A certificate of title is not required for a vehicle owned by a manufacturer or dealer and held for sale or lease, even though incidentally moved on a street or highway or used for purposes of testing or demonstration.
- (j) A bus or a school bus that is not self-propelled and isused exclusively as a construction shanty.
 - (k) A certificate of title is not required for a moped.
- 29 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), for 3 days

- 1 immediately following the date of a properly assigned title or
- 2 signed lease agreement from any person other than a dealer, a
- 3 registration is not required for a vehicle driven or moved on a

- 6 place of storage if the driver has in his or her possession the
- 7 assigned title showing the date of sale or a lease agreement

- 9 (m) A certificate of registration is not required for a pickup10 camper, but a certificate of title is required.
- (n) A new motor vehicle driven or moved on a street or highwayonly for the purpose of moving the vehicle from an accident site to

- 18 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, a
- 19 registration issued to a motor vehicle, recreational vehicle,
- 20 trailer, semitrailer, or pole trailer, when driven or moved on a
- 21 street or highway, that expires on or after March 1, 2020 is valid
- 22 until December 11, 2020. March 31, 2021. If the registration issued
- 23 to a motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or
- 24 pole trailer, when driven or moved on a street or highway, that is
- 25 used for commercial purposes expires on or after March 1, 2020, the
- 26 registration is valid until December 11, 2020. March 31, 2021.
- 27 (3) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
- 28 until December 11, 2020, March 31, 2021, a properly assigned title
- 29 or signed lease agreement from any person other than a dealer is

- 2 Sec. 226. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (13),
- 3 a vehicle registration issued by the secretary of state expires on
- 4 the owner's birthday, unless another expiration date is provided
- 5 for under this act or unless the registration is for the following
- 6 vehicles, in which case registration expires on the last day of
- 7 February:
- 8 (a) A commercial vehicle except for a commercial vehicle
- 9 issued a registration under the international registration plan or
- 10 a pickup truck or van owned by an individual.
- 11 (b) Except for a trailer or semitrailer issued a registration
- 12 under the international registration plan, a trailer or semitrailer
- 13 owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an
- 14 individual; or a pole trailer.
- 15 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (13), the
- 16 expiration date for a registration issued for a motorcycle is the
- 17 motorcycle owner's birthday.
- 18 (3) The expiration date for a registration bearing the letters
- 19 "SEN" or "REP" is February 1.
- 20 (4) In the case of a vehicle owned by a business, corporation,
- 21 or an owner other than an individual, the secretary of state may
- 22 assign or reassign the expiration date of the registration.
- 23 (5) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:
- 24 (a) After the October 1 immediately preceding the year
- 25 designated on the registration, issue a registration upon
- 26 application and payment of the proper fee for a commercial vehicle,
- 27 other than a pickup or van owned by an individual; or a trailer
- 28 owned by a business, corporation, or person other than an
- 29 individual.



- (c) Beginning 45 days before the owner's birthday and 120 days before the expiration date assigned by the secretary of state, issue a registration for a vehicle other than those designated in subsection (1)(a) or (b). However, if an owner whose registration period begins 45 days before his or her birthday will be out of the state during the 45 days immediately preceding expiration of a registration or for other good cause shown cannot apply for a renewal registration within the 45-day period, application for a renewal registration may be made not more than 6 months before expiration.
 - (6) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the secretary of state, upon application and payment of the proper fee, shall issue a registration for a vehicle or a motorcycle to a resident that expires on the owner's birthday. If the owner's next birthday is at least 6 months but not more than 12 months in the future, the owner shall receive a registration valid until the owner's next birthday. If the owner's next birthday is less than 6 months in the future, the owner shall receive a registration valid until the owner's birthday following the owner's next birthday. The tax required under this act for a registration described in this subsection is either of the following:
 - (a) For an original registration, the tax must bear the same relationship to the tax required under section 801 for a 12-month registration as the length of the registration bears to 12 months.

- 1 (b) For a renewal of a registration, either of the following:
- 2 (i) For a registration that is for at least 6 months but not3 more than 12 months, the same amount as for 12 months.
- 4 (ii) For a renewal of a registration that is for more than 12 months, 2 times the amount for 12 months.

Partial months must be considered as whole months in the calculation of the required tax and in the determination of the length of time between the application for a registration and the owner's next birthday. The tax required for that registration must be rounded off to whole dollars as provided in section 801.

- (7) A certificate of title remains valid until canceled by the secretary of state for cause or upon a transfer of an interest shown on the certificate of title.
- 14 (8) The secretary of state, upon request, shall issue special registration for commercial vehicles, valid for 6 months after the date of issue, if the full registration fee exceeds \$50.00, on the payment of 1/2 the full registration fee and a service charge as enumerated in section 802(1).
- 19 (9) The secretary of state may issue a special registration20 for each of the following:
- 21 (a) A new vehicle purchased or leased outside of this state
 22 and delivered in this state to the purchaser or lessee by the
 23 manufacturer of that vehicle for removal to a place outside of this
 24 state, if a certification is made that the vehicle will be
 25 primarily used, stored, and registered outside of this state and
 26 will not be returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for
 27 use or storage.
- (b) A vehicle purchased or leased in this state and deliveredto the purchaser or lessee by a dealer or by the owner of the

- vehicle for removal to a place outside of this state, if a
 certification is made that the vehicle will be primarily used,
 stored, and registered outside of this state and will not be
 returned to this state by the purchaser or lessee for use or
 storage.
- 6 (10) A special registration issued under subsection (9) is 7 valid for not more than 30 days after the date of issuance, and a 8 fee must be collected for each special registration as provided in 9 section 802(3). The special registration may be in the form 10 determined by the secretary of state. If a dealer makes a retail 11 sale or lease of a vehicle to a purchaser or lessee who is qualified and eligible to obtain a special registration, the dealer 12 shall apply for the special registration for the purchaser or 13 14 lessee. If a person other than a dealer sells or leases a vehicle 15 to a purchaser or lessee who is qualified and eligible to obtain a special registration, the purchaser or lessee shall appear in 16 person, or by a person exercising the purchaser's or lessee's power 17 18 of attorney, at an office of the secretary of state and furnish a 19 certification that the person is the bona fide purchaser or lessee 20 or that the person has granted the power of attorney, together with 21 other forms required for the issuance of the special registration and provide the secretary of state with proof that the vehicle is 22 23 covered by an automobile insurance policy issued under section 3101 of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3101, or proof 24 25 that the vehicle is covered by a policy of insurance issued by an insurer under section 3163 of the insurance code of 1956, 1956 PA 26 27 218, MCL 500.3163. The certification required in this subsection must contain all of the following: 28
 - (a) The address of the purchaser or lessee.

- (b) A statement that the vehicle is purchased or leased for
 registration outside of this state.
- 3 (c) A statement that the vehicle must be primarily used,4 stored, and registered outside of this state.
- 5 (d) The name of the jurisdiction in which the vehicle is to be6 registered.
 - (e) Other information requested by the secretary of state.
- 8 (11) In the case of a commercial vehicle, trailer, or
- 9 semitrailer issued a registration under the international
- 10 registration plan, the secretary of state in mutual agreement with
- 11 the owner may assign or reassign the expiration date of the
- 12 registration. However, the expiration date agreed to must be either
- 13 March 31, June 30, September 30, or December 31 or beginning on
- 14 February 19, 2019, the last day of a calendar month. Renewals
- 15 expiring on or after June 30, 2020 must be for a minimum of at
- 16 least 12 months if there is a change in the established expiration
- 17 date. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, a
- 18 commercial vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer registration issued
- 19 under this subsection that expires on or after March 1, 2020 is
- 20 valid until December 11, 2020.March 31, 2021.
- 21 (12) The expiration date for a multiyear registration issued
- 22 for a leased vehicle must be the date the lease expires but must
- 23 not be for a period longer than 24 months.
- 24 (13) A vehicle registration described in subsection (1) or a
- 25 motorcycle registration described in subsection (2) that expires on
- 26 or after March 1, 2020 is valid until December 11, 2020. March 31,
- 27 2021.

- Sec. 255. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, a
- 29 person shall not operate, nor shall an owner knowingly permit to be

- 1 operated, upon any highway, a vehicle required to be registered
- 2 under this act unless, except as otherwise provided in this
- 3 subsection, no later than 30 days after the vehicle is registered
- 4 or the vehicle's registration is renewed, a valid registration
- 5 plate issued for the vehicle by the department for the current
- 6 registration year is attached to and displayed on the vehicle as
- 7 required by this chapter. For purposes of this subsection, a
- 8 printed or electronic copy of a valid registration or verification
- 9 of a valid registration through the L.E.I.N. is proof that the

- 23 of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90
- 24 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 25 (3) A person who operates a vehicle licensed under the
- 26 international registration plan and does not have a valid
- 27 registration due to nonpayment of the apportioned fee is guilty of
- 28 a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90
- 29 days, or by a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both. In addition,

- (5) An individual holding a valid chauffeur's license need notprocure an operator's license.
- 17 (6) An operator's or chauffeur's license that expires on or 18 after March 1, 2020 is valid until December 11, 2020.March 31, 19 2021.
 - Sec. 306. (1) The secretary of state, on receiving an application for a temporary instruction permit from an individual who is 18 years of age or older, may issue that permit that entitles the applicant, while carrying the permit, to drive a motor vehicle other than a motor vehicle requiring an indorsement under section 312a or a vehicle group designation under section 312e on the highways for a period of 180 days when accompanied by a licensed adult operator or chauffeur who is actually occupying a seat beside the driver. A temporary instruction permit issued under this subsection that expires on or after March 1, 2020 is valid

- (2) The secretary of state may issue an original operator's license and designate level 1, 2, or 3 graduated licensing provisions to an individual who is less than 18 years of age, has been licensed in another state or country, and has satisfied the applicable requirements of section 310e. An original operator's license with a designated level 1, 2, or 3 graduated licensing provision issued under this subsection that expires on or after March 1, 2020 is valid until December 11, 2020. March 31, 2021.
 - (3) A student enrolled in a driver education course as that term is defined in section 3 of the driver education provider and instructor act, 2006 PA 384, MCL 256.623, or a motorcycle safety course approved by the department of state may operate a motor vehicle that does not require a group designation under section 312e without holding an operator's license or permit while under the direct supervision of the program instructor.
 - (4) A student enrolled in a driver education course as that term is defined in section 3 of the driver education provider and instructor act, 2006 PA 384, MCL 256.623, and who has successfully completed 10 hours of classroom instruction and the equivalent of 2 hours of behind-the-wheel training may be issued a temporary driver education certificate furnished by the department of state that authorizes a student to drive a motor vehicle, other than a motor vehicle that requires an indorsement under section 312a or a vehicle group designation under section 312e, when accompanied by a licensed parent or guardian, or when accompanied by a nonlicensed parent or guardian and a licensed adult for the purpose of receiving additional instruction until the end of the student's driver education course. A temporary driver education certificate

- issued under this subsection that expires on or after March 1, 2020
 is valid until December 11, 2020.March 31, 2021.
- (5) Beginning January 1, 2015, the secretary of state, on 3 receiving proper application from an individual 16 or 17 years of 4 age who is enrolled in or has successfully completed an approved 5 6 motorcycle safety course under section 811a, or an individual who 7 is 18 years of age or older and who holds a valid operator's or 8 chauffeur's license, may issue a motorcycle temporary instruction 9 permit that entitles the applicant, while carrying the permit, to 10 operate a motorcycle on the public streets and highways for a
- (a) The applicant shall operate the motorcycle under the
 constant visual supervision of a licensed motorcycle operator who
 is at least 18 years of age.

- (b) The applicant shall not operate the motorcycle at night.
- 16 (c) The applicant shall not operate the motorcycle with a

- Sec. 306a. (1) The secretary of state may issue a commercial learner's permit that entitles an individual to drive a vehicle requiring a vehicle group designation or indorsement under section 312e if all of the following apply:
- (a) The individual submits a proper application and meets therequirements of 49 CFR part 383.
 - (b) The individual is 18 years of age or older.

An individual may 22 apply 1 time to renew the permit for an additional 180 days without 23 taking the knowledge tests described in subsection (1) if the 24 individual applies for the renewal before the expiration of the 25 original permit.
- (4) Notwithstanding subsection (3), a commercial learner's
 permit issued under this section that expires on or after March 1,
 2020 is valid until December 11, 2020.March 31, 2021.
- Sec. 309. (1) Before issuing a license, the secretary of state

shall examine each applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's 1 license who at the time of the application is not the holder of a 2 valid, unrevoked operator's or chauffeur's license under a law of 3 this state providing for the licensing of drivers. Before the 4 5 secretary of state authorizes an individual to administer vehicle 6 group designation or endorsement knowledge tests, that individual 7 must successfully complete both a state and Federal Bureau of 8 Investigation fingerprint-based criminal history check or the 9 equivalent through the department of state police. In all other 10 cases, the secretary of state may waive the examination, except 11 that an examination must not be waived if it appears from the 12 application, from the apparent physical or mental condition of the applicant, or from any other information that has come to the 13 14 secretary of state from another source, that the applicant does not 15 possess the physical, mental, or other qualifications necessary to 16 operate a motor vehicle in a manner as not to jeopardize the safety 17 of persons or property, or that the applicant is not entitled to a license under section 303. A licensee who applies for the renewal 18 19 of his or her license by mail under section 307 shall certify to 20 his or her physical capability to operate a motor vehicle. The secretary of state may check the applicant's driving record through 21 the National Driver Register and the Commercial Driver's License 22 23 Information System before issuing a license under this section. 24 (2) The secretary of state may appoint sheriffs, their 25 deputies, the chiefs of police of cities and villages that have 26 organized police departments within this state, their duly

28 29 authorized representatives, or employees of the secretary of state as examining officers for the purpose of examining applicants for

operator's and chauffeur's licenses. An examining officer shall

- conduct examinations of applicants for operator's and chauffeur's
 licenses in accordance with this chapter and the rules promulgated
 by the secretary of state under subsection (3). After conducting an
 examination an examining officer shall make a written report of his
 or her findings and recommendations to the secretary of state.
- 6 (3) The secretary of state shall promulgate rules under the 7 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 8 24.328, for the examination of the applicant's physical and mental 9 qualifications to operate a motor vehicle in a manner as not to 10 jeopardize the safety of persons or property, and shall ascertain 11 whether facts exist that would bar the issuance of a license under 12 section 303. The secretary of state may consider a written medical report and recommendation submitted under section 5139 of the 13 14 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.5139, from the personal 15 physician or optometrist of an applicant, in making the examination 16 regarding the applicant's physical and mental qualifications to 17 operate a motor vehicle under this section and R 257.851 to R 257.855 of the Michigan Administrative Code. A report received by 18 19 the secretary of state from a physician or an optometrist under 20 this section is confidential. The secretary of state shall also ascertain whether the applicant has sufficient knowledge of the 21 English language to understand highway warnings or direction signs 22 23 written in that language. The examination must not include 24 investigation of facts other than those facts directly pertaining 25 to the ability of the applicant to operate a motor vehicle with safety or facts declared to be prerequisite to the issuance of a 26 27 license under this act.
 - (4) The secretary of state shall not issue an original operator's or chauffeur's license without a vehicle group

- designation or indorsement without an examination that includes a 1 driving skills test conducted by the secretary of state or by a 2 designated examining officer under subsection (2) or section 310e. 3 The secretary of state may enter into an agreement with another 4 5 public or private corporation or agency to conduct a driving skills 6 test conducted under this section. Before the secretary of state 7 authorizes an individual to administer a corporation's or agency's 8 driver skills testing operations or authorizes an examiner to 9 conduct a driving skills test, that individual or examiner must 10 successfully complete both a state and Federal Bureau of 11 Investigation fingerprint-based criminal history check through the department of state police as required by law and as provided under 12 49 CFR 384.228.
