A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 101. There is appropriated for various state departments and agencies to supplement appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, from the following funds:

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PART 2

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PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

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GENERAL SECTIONS

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Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020 is \$6,000,000.00 and total state spending from state sources to be paid to local units of government is \$6,000,000.00.

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Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under this part and the departments, commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

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Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount appropriated under this act, the legislature may, by a concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within this act for the particular department, board, commission, office, or institution.

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DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE

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Sec. 301. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 from the disaster and emergency contingency fund shall be allocated to a county with a population of more than 80,000 and less than 85,000, to a county with a population of more than 200,000 and less than 205,000, to a county with a population of more than 15,000 and less than 16,000, to a county with a population of more than 25,600 and less than

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1 25,700, to a county with a population of more than 25,800 and less
2 than 25,900, and to a city with a population of more than 35,000
3 located in a county with a population of more than 80,000 and less
4 than 85,000, according to the most recent federal decennial census.
5 Funding shall be used to reimburse project restoration costs and
6 expenses caused by the federally declared disaster impacting those
7 counties. Restoration projects include, but are not limited to,
8 debris removal, emergency protective measures such as road
9 blockades, sheltering, and evacuations, chemical contamination
10 clean-up efforts, and the repair of real estate and personal
11 property.

12 (2) Funding appropriated in part 1 for grants to counties or
13 municipalities must be made in accordance with section 19 of the
14 emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.419.

15 Sec. 302. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 from the disaster
16 and emergency contingency fund shall be allocated to a county with
17 a population of more than 80,000 and less than 85,000 and to a city
18 with a population of more than 35,000 located in a county with a
19 population of more than 80,000 and less than 85,000, according to
20 the most recent federal decennial census. Funding shall be used to
21 reimburse project restoration costs and expenses caused by the
22 federally declared disaster in that county. Restoration projects
23 include, but are not limited to, debris removal, emergency
24 protective measures such as road blockades, sheltering, and
25 evacuations, chemical contamination clean-up efforts, and the
26 repaid of real estate and personal property. Expenditures for
27 chemical contamination clean-up efforts shall not be made for
28 projects where existing parties are responsible for monitoring and
29 remediating contaminated properties.



1 (2) Funds must be allocated with priority given to supporting
2 housing assistance costs for individuals displaced from their
3 residence.

4 Sec. 303. The department of state police shall seek
5 reimbursement for flood-related expenditures made from the
6 appropriation in part 1 from the disaster and emergency contingency
7 fund in the event that any party is found to be criminally or
8 civilly liable for the failure of either the Edenville dam or the
9 Sanford dam.

10 Sec. 304. By September 30, 2020, the department of state
11 police shall submit a report to the senate and house appropriations
12 committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies that includes
13 all of the following information:

14 (a) Name and location of any entity that received funding from
15 the disaster and emergency contingency fund for costs related to
16 the Edenville and Sanford dam incidents.

17 (b) Purpose and use of each expenditure that was made.

18 (c) Amount of federal funding that was provided for flood
19 response related to the Edenville and Sanford dam incidents and an
20 itemization of any expenses covered by the disaster and emergency
21 contingency fund related to these incidents that are eligible for
22 reimbursement.

23 (d) Status of any programs that received support from the
24 disaster and emergency contingency fund due to the Edenville and
25 Sanford dam incidents.

26 (e) Job titles and number of state full-time equated
27 positions, by department, that were engaged in responding to the
28 Edenville and Sanford dam incidents.

29 (f) Listing of all local and county units that applied for



1 disaster and emergency contingency fund assistance grants and the
2 determination that was made on each of the applications.
