THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) The department shall waive the fee for an initial
- 2 license or initial registration that is otherwise required under
- 3 this act, or an application processing fee charged by the
- 4 department for an initial license or initial registration, if the
- 5 applicant is an meets 1 of the following requirements:
- 6 (a) Is actively serving in the armed forces or the uniformed 7 services.
- $\bf 8$ (b) Is an individual who served in the armed forces or
- 9 uniformed services and he or she provides to the department a form





- 1 DD214, form DD215, or any other form that is satisfactory to the
- 2 department that demonstrates he or she was separated from that
- 3 service with an honorable character of service or under honorable
- 4 conditions (general) character of service.
- 5 (c) Is a dependent of a member of the armed forces, a
- 6 dependent of a member of the uniformed services, or a dependent of
- 7 a veteran and he or she provides proof acceptable to the department
- 8 that he or she is a dependent as described in this subdivision.

- 10 (a) "Armed forces" means that term as defined in section 2 of
- 11 the veteran right to employment services act, 1994 PA 39, MCL
- 12 35.1092.section 103 of the occupational code, MCL 339.103.
- 13 (b) "Dependent" means that term as defined in section 104 of
- 14 the occupational code, MCL 339.104.
- 15 (c) "Uniformed service" means that term as defined in section

- 17 (d) "Veteran" means that term as defined in section 1 of 1965
- 18 PA 190, MCL 35.61.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 20 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 21 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 22 unless Senate Bill No. 158 of the 101st Legislature is enacted into
- 23 law.
