D. in political science/public administration from Michigan State University. Academically, he has specialized in educational finance, technology in politics, and higher education policies. He has taught numerous courses in public administration, state government, and technology in government at Michigan State University, Albion College, Kalamazoo College, and Alma College; married 1972; son, Matthew, daughter Kari; University Lutheran Church; Michigan State Board of Education (secretary, 1974); County Commission (Ingham County); trustee, Michigan Lung Association; trustee, Michigan Multiple Sclerosis Society; Board of Directors, Lutheran Social Services of Michigan; former national officer of Kappa Delta Pi; chairperson, Ingham County Republican Party; elected to State Senate in 1978. Sederburg presently serves on the Senate Appropriations Committee: he chairs two of the Appropriations Subcommittees (General Government and Higher Education) and is a member of the School Aid (K-12) and Department of Education Subcommittee. He also chairs the Senate Health Policy Standing Committee. He developed the first political/constituent forum computer bulletin board and initiated the creation of a higher education forum computer bulletin board. He also chairs the Michigan Capitol Committee which is overseeing the restoration of the Capitol Building.
