***AN ADDENDUM TO THE SENATE FISCAL AGENCY ANALYSIS OF SENATE BILLS 380 AND 381 AS PASSED BY THE SENATE***

The House State Affairs Committee adopted Substitutes H-4 for Senate Bills 380 and 381. House Bill 380 (Substitute H-4) would establish the State Survey and Remonumentation Fund, and House Bill 381 (Substitute H-4) would amend the Revised Judicature Act to impose two additional \$2 fees for the recording of any instrument with a county register of deeds. One of the \$2 fees would go to the county in which it was collected, and the other to the fund, to implement county or multicounty monumentation or remonumentation plans. Each county would receive an annual grant equal to at least twenty percent of the total amount of money collected from these additional fees in that county during the preceding calendar year. If a county failed to establish a plan, then the State Survey and Remonumentation Commission would be required to spend at least twenty percent of the aggregate amount collected in that county to initiate and implement a plan for that county. In addition, at least five percent of the fund would be made available for grants for county or multicounty perpetual monument maintenance plans. Both bills would take effect January 1, 1991.
