THE APPARENT PROBLEM:

The Department of Social Services needs to acquire property in the Upper Peninsula in order to build a juvenile detention center. The city of Escanaba has offered for this purpose some 24 acres of land. Legislation is needed to authorize the acquisition.

THE CONTENT OF THE BILL:

The bill would authorize the state administrative board to acquire for not more than \$1 approximately 24 acres of land in the city of Escanaba, Delta County, to construct a juvenile detention center for the Department of Social Services. All documents regarding the acquisition would require the attorney general's approval.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

The bill would cost the state \$1 for conveyance of title to the property. (7-12-89)

ARGUMENTS:

For:

The proposed property transfer represents good mutual effort on behalf of the state government and local communities to work together: construction of the detention center will provide jobs in the Escanaba area, and the state will acquire the land for almost no cost.
