SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 349 as introduced 4-20-89:

The bill would amend the Public Health Code to include any androgenic anabolic steroid, human growth hormone, or related compound within the list of controlled substances designated in the Code as a Schedule 2 drug.

This would include, but not be limited to, any of the following controlled substances: clostebol, dehydrochlormethyl testosterone, ethylestrenol, methandrostenolone, methenolone, methyltestosterone, fluoxymesterone, mesterolone, nandrolone, nandrolone decanoate, nandrolone phenpropionate, norethandrolone, oxandrolone, oxymesterone, human growth releasing hormone, dromostanolone, oxymetholone, stanozolol, somatotropin, testosterone, testosterone cypionate, testosterone enanthate, testosterone propionate, and testosterone-like related compounds.

(The Code characterizes a Schedule 2 drug as a substance that has a high potential for abuse; has accepted medical use in treatment in this country, or currently accepted medical use with severe restrictions; and the abuse of which could lead to severe psychic or physical dependence.)
