SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 364 as introduced 4-25-89:

The bill would amend Public Act 261 of 1927, which prevents the acquisition, construction, operation, maintenance or building of garbage disposal plants in certain cities and villages without approval of those local governments, to exempt the construction, acquisition, improvement, extension, enlargement, operation, or maintenance of a facility under the "County Department of Solid Waste Management Act", proposed by Senate Bill 363, from the requirements of Public Act 261. The bill is tie-barred to Senate Bill 363.
