SUMMARY OF SENATE BILLS 707 and 708 as introduced 11-30-89:

Senate Bills 707 and 708 would amend the divorce act and the Age of Majority Act, respectively, to allow a court to order a parent to pay support for his or her 18-year-old or older child during the time the child was enrolled in high school. Senate Bill 707 would prohibit such an order from applying after the child was 19 years old. In addition, while the Age of Majority Act established 18 years of age as the "legal age for all purposes", Senate Bill 708 specifies that 18 years would be the age of majority unless otherwise provided in the State Constitution.
