SUMMARY OF SENATE BILL 1084 as introduced 9-18-90:

The bill would amend the Michigan Penal Code to specify that a person who knowingly or intentionally assisted another person to commit or attempt to commit suicide would be guilty of a felony, punishable by imprisonment for up to four years, a fine of up to \$2,000, or both.
