ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 4103

AN ACT to amend section 1 of Act No. 4 of the Local Acts of 1929, entitled "An act to preserve game; prohibit hunting on Sunday in Sanilac county; and to prescribe penalties for the violation hereof; and to repeal act number two hundred ninety-seven of the public acts of nineteen hundred twenty-three;" and to provide for a referendum.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 4 of the Local Acts of 1929, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt for game with firearms or dogs on Sunday, on any lands or premises in the county of Sanilac in this state. The purpose of this act is to preserve the game in Sanilac county. The word "Sunday" as used in this act shall mean the first day of the week.

Section 2. (1) This amendatory act shall not take effect until it is submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the county of Sanilac and ratified by a majority of the electors voting on the question. The question of the adoption of this amendatory act shall be submitted to the voters of the county at the next general election, after the passage of this amendatory act, and like notice of the submission shall be given as is required by law in the case of elections to elect county officers, and shall be submitted in substantially the following form:

- (2) The result of the vote shall be canvassed by the board of state canvassers.
- (3) If a majority of the electors voting on the question, as determined by the canvass of votes cast, vote in favor of the adoption of this amendatory act, it shall become effective 10 days following the certification of the election results.
