ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 4757

AN ACT to amend sections 18 and 19 of chapter II of Act No. 146 of the Public Acts of 1925, entitled "An act to revise and consolidate the laws relating to the relief and support of poor persons; to prescribe penalties for violations of certain provisions of this act, and to repeal certain acts relating to poor persons," being sections 402.18 and 402.19 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Sections 18 and 19 of chapter II of Act No. 146 of the Public Acts of 1925, being sections 402.18 and 402.19 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER II

Sec. 18. Any person who shall bring or remove, or cause to be brought or removed, any poor or indigent person, from outside this state, into any county within it, with intent to make such county chargeable with the support of the poor person, shall forfeit and pay \$50.00, to be recovered before the district or municipal court of the judicial district or municipality into which the poor person was brought, or in which the offender is located; and shall also be required to transport the poor person out of the state, or support him or her at his or her own expense.

Sec. 19. It shall be lawful for the court before whom the person shall be convicted for a violation of the provisions of the section 18, to require of the person satisfactory security that he or she will, within a reasonable time, to be named by the court, transport the person out of the state, or indemnify the county for all charges and expenses which may have been, or may be incurred in the support of the poor person. If the person shall neglect or refuse to give the security when required, it shall be the duty of the court to commit him or her to the county jail for a term not exceeding 3 months.
