ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 4756

AN ACT to amend section 6 of Act No. 355 of the Public Acts of 1927, entitled "An act to provide for the appointment of a board of commissioners who shall have the management and control of the Mackinac Island state park, defining its powers and duties; and to repeal Act No. 222 of the Public Acts of 1895," being section 318.66 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 6 of Act No. 355 of the Public Acts of 1927, being section 318.66 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6. The superintendent of the Mackinac Island state park may appoint, by and with the consent of the board of commissioners, such number of special police as the board may by resolution direct, which special police shall be under the supervision and direction of the superintendent, who shall be charged with the execution of such rules and regulations for the care and preservation of the park, and the property in and about the fort, as may be prescribed in rules duly formulated by the board. Such special police shall be vested with the authority of sheriffs of the island, and may apprehend and arrest, without warrant, any person whom they may find violating the rules which shall have been published relative to good order, the preservation of property, the mutilation of landmarks, or the destruction or injury to growing trees and shrubs. The special police are authorized to make complaint against offenders against the rules of the government of Mackinac Island state park, before the district court of the judicial district that includes Mackinac Island and the judges are hereby authorized to take cognizance, hear, try and determine such complaints and pass sentence upon such offenders, in accordance with the procedures applicable in misdemeanor cases.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
