HOUSE BILL No. 4104

February 7, 1989, Introduced by Rep. Perry Bullard and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of Act No. 302 of the Public Acts of 1982, entitled

"An act to create the Michigan justice training commission and the Michigan justice training fund; to provide the powers and duties of certain state agencies; to provide for the distribution and expenditure of funds; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

section 3 as amended by Act No. 184 of the Public Acts of 1983, being sections 18.421, 18.422, 18.423, 18.424, 18.425, and 18.426 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 9.

- 13 TRAINING PROGRAM HAS EXHAUSTED ALL REASONABLE EFFORTS TO LOCATE A
- 14 SIMILAR TRAINING PROGRAM IN THIS STATE, AND THE COMMISSION IS
- 15 SATISFIED THAT A SIMILAR TRAINING PROGRAM IS NOT AVAILABLE IN

- 23 (3) INVESTMENT EARNINGS FROM THE MICHIGAN JUSTICE TRAINING
- 24 FUND ASSETS SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE MICHIGAN JUSTICE TRAINING

- 26 Sec. 6. A city, village, township, county, or state or
- 27 local agency EACH ELIGIBLE ENTITY AND STATE OR LOCAL AGENCY
