

HOUSE BILL No. 4213

February 16, 1989, Introduced by Reps. Stallworth, Gubow, DeMars, Hickner, Wallace, Bennane, Saunders, Kilpatrick, Kosteva, Profit, Palamara, Joe Young, Sr., Harrison, DeBeaussaert, Leland, Stopczynski, Willis Bullard, Sikkema, Law, Pitoniak, Hoffman, Watkins, Scott and Dunaskiss and referred to the Committee on Public Utilities.

A bill to amend Act No. 3 of the Public Acts of 1939, entitled as amended

"An act to provide for the regulation and control of public utilities and other services affected with a public interest within this state; to create a public service commission and to prescribe and define its powers and duties; to abolish the Michigan public utilities commission and to confer the powers and duties vested by law therein on the public service commission; to provide for the continuance, transfer, and completion of certain matters and proceedings; to abolish automatic adjustment clauses; to prohibit rate increases without notice and hearing; to qualify residential energy conservation programs permitted under state law for certain federal exemption; to provide for a restructuring of rates for certain utilities; to provide for appeals; to provide appropriations; to declare the effect of this act; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal all acts contrary to this act,"

as amended, being sections 460.1 to 460.8 of the Michigan

Compiled Laws, by adding section 5a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Act No. 3 of the Public Acts of 1939, as
2 amended, being sections 460.1 to 460.8 of the Michigan Compiled
3 Laws, is amended by adding section 5a to read as follows:

4 SEC. 5A. THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION SHALL MAKE
5 AN ANNUAL REPORT, SUMMARIZING THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMISSION,
6 TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST MONDAY
7 OF MARCH OF EACH YEAR. THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL BE A SUMMARY OF
8 COMMISSION ACTIVITIES AND MAY INCLUDE RULES, OPINIONS, AND ORDERS
9 PROMULGATED OR ENTERED BY THE COMMISSION DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR
10 COVERED BY THE ANNUAL REPORT. THE REPORT SHALL ALSO CONTAIN ANY
11 OTHER INFORMATION WHICH THE COMMISSION CONSIDERS TO BE OF VALUE.
