

HOUSE BILL No. 4268

February 21, 1989, Introduced by Reps. Hunter, DeMars, Brown, Berman, Murphy, Ciaramitaro, Joe Young, Jr., Gire, Scott, Honigman, Jondahl, Wallace, Webb, Kilpatrick, Bankes, Stabenow, Saunders, Martin, Leland, Barns and Hollister and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Youth.

A bill to amend section 1 of Act No. 84 of the Public Acts of 1949, entitled

"An act to provide for transfers of inmates of certain state institutions and agencies to other state institutions and agencies for the purpose of receiving care and training,"

as amended by Act No. 74 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 720.601 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 84 of the Public Acts of
2 1949, as amended by Act No. 74 of the Public Acts of 1988, being
3 section 720.601 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
4 as follows:

5 Sec. 1. A person who has been committed by the probate
6 court or a court of general criminal jurisdiction to an
7 institution or agency of the state which is authorized to receive
8 juveniles under the direction of the department of mental health,

1 department of corrections, or the ~~department of social services~~
 2 CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES AGENCY for the purpose of treatment,
 3 or training, or both, may be transferred from that institution to
 4 any other institution or agency of the state, if it appears to
 5 the satisfaction of the superintendent of the institution to
 6 which the person has been committed that the person will substan-
 7 tially benefit from the care and training in the other institu-
 8 tion or facility and that the interests of the person and of the
 9 state will be best served thereby.

10 Section 2. This amendatory act shall take effect October 1,
 11 1990.

12 Section 3. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
 13 all of the following bills of the 85th Legislature are enacted
 14 into law:
