## **HOUSE BILL No. 4510**

March 22, 1989, Introduced by Rep. Jacobetti and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend the title and sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act No. 152 of the Public Acts of 1984, entitled

"Carp river forge advisory board act,"

being sections 399.71, 399.72, and 399.73 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. The title and sections 1, 2, and 3 of Act
- 2 No. 152 of the Public Acts of 1984, being sections 399.71,
- 3 399.72, and 399.73 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 TITLE
- 6 An act to create the <del>Carp river forge</del> MICHIGAN IRON INDUS-
- 7 TRY MUSEUM advisory board within the department of state; and to
- 8 prescribe its powers and duties.

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "-Carp river forge MICHIGAN IRON INDUSTRY MUSEUM advisory board
- 3 act".
- 4 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 5 (a) "Advisory board" means the Carp river forge MICHIGAN
- 6 IRON INDUSTRY MUSEUM advisory board created pursuant to BY
- 7 section 3.
- 8 (b) "Museum site" means certain state land and facilities in
- 9 the county of Marquette constituting an historical commemoration
- 10 of the first iron production area in the Lake Superior region.
- 11 Sec. 3. (1) The Carp river forge MICHIGAN IRON INDUSTRY
- 12 MUSEUM advisory board is created within the department of state.
- 13 (2) The advisory board shall consist of 9 members appointed
- 14 by the governor, including all of the following:
- 15 (a) One representative from the city of Negaunee and -one- 1
- 16 representative from the city of Marquette.
- (b) One representative from the township of Negaunee.
- (c) One representative from the county board of commission-
- 19 ers of the county of Marquette.
- (d) One representative from the county historical society of
- 21 the county of Marquette.
- (e) One representative from the mineral industry.
- 23 (f) Three members from the general citizenry of the state,
- 24 at least 1 of whom is a resident of the Upper Peninsula.
- 25 (3) Each member shall be a registered voter and a resident
- 26 of this state.

- (4) Not more than 5 members shall be of the same political
  party at any 1 time.
- 3 (5) Except for members first appointed, the term of office
- 4 of each member shall be 4 years. Of the members first appointed
- 5 under subsection (2), 3 shall serve for 4 years, 3 shall serve
- 6 for 3 years, and 3 shall serve for 2 years. Vacancies on the
- 7 advisory board shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 8 appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- 9 (6) A member shall not receive any compensation for his or
- 10 her services as a member of the advisory board, except for
- 11 expenses incurred while acting as an official representative of
- 12 the advisory board. -, but HOWEVER, A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY
- 13 BOARD SHALL not RECEIVE more than \$75.00 per day for not more
- 14 than 24 days per calendar year, for not more than 2 calendar
- 15 years. All claims for expenses shall be paid pursuant to voucher
- 16 submitted to the department of treasury.
- 17 (7) The members annually shall elect a chairperson,
- 18 vice-chairperson, and secretary.
- 19 (8) The advisory board shall meet not less than twice each
- 20 calendar year on call of the chairperson. A majority of the mem-
- 21 bers shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
