HOUSE BILL No. 4613

April 12, 1989, Introduced by Reps. Harrison, Saunders, Berman, Jondahl, Gire, Brown, Stallworth, Bennane, DeMars, Perry Bullard, Joe Young, Jr., Emerson, Hollister and Wallace and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to create a small cities community development block grant fund; to provide for capitalization of the fund; and to provide that a minimum percentage of the fund be allocated to the Michigan state housing development authority for certain purposes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Department" means the department of commerce.
- 3 (b) "Fund" means the small cities community development
- 4 block grant fund created by section 2.
- Sec. 2. There is created in the department a small cities
- 6 community development block grant fund. The fund shall be admin-
- 7 istered by the department. The fund shall be capitalized with
- 8 all of the following:

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- 1 (a) Community development block grant revenue allocated to 2 the state under section 106(d) of title I of the housing and 3 community development act of 1974, Public Law 93-383, 42
- 5 (b) Program income realized from funds distributed by the 6 state pursuant to section 106(d) of title I of Public Law 93-383, 7 42 U.S.C. 5306.
- 8 (c) Recovered, unexpended state obligations to make grants 9 with funds allocated to the state pursuant to section 106(d) of 10 title I of Public Law 93-383, 42 U.S.C. 5306.
- 11 (d) Gifts and other sources of revenue designated for the 12 fund.
- Sec. 3. Disbursements from the fund shall be made only for 14 purposes set forth in section 105 of title I of Public Law 15 93-383, 42 U.S.C. 5305. Not less than 35% of the money disbursed 16 from the fund each fiscal year shall be allocated to the Michigan 17 state housing development authority created by the state housing 18 development authority act of 1966, Act No. 346 of the Public Acts 19 of 1966, being sections 125.1401 to 124.1498f of the Michigan 20 Compiled Laws, to assist activities related to housing and 21 described in section 105(a)(1),(3), (4), (6), (8), (13), or (15) 22 of title I of Public Law 93-383, 42 U.S.C. 5305.
