A bill to amend section 7 of Act No. 33 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled

"An act to prohibit the dissemination, exhibiting, or displaying of certain sexually explicit matter to minors; to prohibit certain misrepresentations facilitating the dissemination of sexually explicit matter to minors; to provide penalties; to provide for declaratory judgments and injunctive relief in certain instances; to impose certain duties upon prosecuting attorneys and the circuit court; to preempt local units of government from proscribing certain conduct; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

being section 722.677 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 7 of Act No. 33 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1978, being section 722.677 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 7. (1) A person is guilty of displaying obscene
- 5 matter to a minor if -that- THE person possesses managerial

- (5) Displaying obscene matter to a minor is a misdemeanor,23 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or a fine24 of not more than \$5,000.00, or both.
- 25 Section 2. This amendatory act shall take effect July 1, 26 1989.
