## **HOUSE BILL No. 4716**

April 27, 1989, Introduced by Reps. DeLange, Middaugh, Hillegonds, Willis Bullard and Muxlow and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend section 307 of Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, entitled as amended
"Michigan vehicle code,"

as amended by Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 257.307 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 307 of Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1949, as amended by Act No. 346 of the Public Acts of 1988, being
- 3 section 257.307 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Sec. 307. (1) An application for an operator's or
- 6 chauffeur's license shall be made upon a form furnished by the
- 7 secretary of state and shall contain ALL OF the following:
- 8 (a) For an operator's or chauffeur's license, full name,
- 9 date of birth, address of residence, information required or

- permitted on the license pursuant to this chapter, and signature
  of the applicant.
- 3 (b) For an operator's or chauffeur's license with a vehicle
- 4 group designation or indorsement, full name, social security
- 5 number, date of birth, address of residence, height, sex, infor-
- 6 mation required or permitted on the license pursuant to this
- 7 chapter, and signature of the applicant.
- 8 (c) For an operator's or chauffeur's license with a vehicle
- 9 group designation or indorsement, the following certifications
- 10 -shall be made by the applicant:
- (i) That the applicant meets the applicable federal physical
- 12 driver qualification requirements pursuant to 49 C.F.R. part 39!
- 13 if the applicant operates or intends to operate in interstate
- 14 commerce or meets the applicable physical qualifications pursuant
- 15 to the rules promulgated by the department of state police under
- 16 the motor carrier safety act of 1963, Act No. 181 of the Public
- 17 Acts of 1963, being sections 480.11 to 480.21 of the Michigan
- 18 Compiled Laws, if the applicant operates or intends to operate in
- 19 intrastate commerce.
- 20 (ii) That the vehicle in which the applicant will take the
- 21 driving skills tests is representative of the type of vehicle the
- 22 applicant operates or intends to operate.
- 23 (iii) That the applicant has not been convicted of an
- 24 offense as described in section 312f or 319b.
- 25 (iv) That the applicant does not have a driver's license
- 26 from more than 1 state.

- (d) For an operator's or chauffeur's license with a vehicle
- 2 group designation or indorsement and for which the applicant
- 3 claims a waiver of the driving test as provided in section 312f,
- 4 the following additional certifications -shall be made by the
- 5 applicant concerning the 2-year period immediately prior to
- 6 application:
- 7 (i) That the applicant has not had more than 1 license.
- 8 (ii) That the applicant has not had any license suspended,
- 9 revoked, or canceled.
- 10 (iii) That the applicant has not been convicted of any
- II offense listed in section 319b while operating a motor vehicle.
- (iv) That the applicant has not been convicted of a moving
- 13 violation under state or local law relating to motor vehicle
- 14 traffic control arising in connection with any traffic accident.
- 15 (v) That the applicant is regularly employed in a job
- 16 requiring the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.
- 17 (vi) That the applicant qualifies under either of the
- 18 following:
- (A) Has passed a behind-the-wheel driving test given by a
- 20 state with a classified licensing and testing system and taken in
- 21 a representative vehicle for that applicant's driver's license
- 22 classification.
- 23 (B) Has operated, for at least 2 years immediately preceding
- 24 application, a vehicle representative of the commercial motor
- 25 vehicle group or passenger vehicle for which he or she is
- 26 applying.

- (2) An applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's license 2 may be photographed -simultaneously at the time the application 3 for the -respective license is made. The secretary of state 4 shall acquire by purchase or lease the equipment for taking the 5 -pictures PHOTOGRAPHS and SHALL furnish -it THE EQUIPMENT to 6 the local unit. Equipment purchased or leased for carrying out 7 this act PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION shall be acquired under stan-8 dard purchasing procedures of the department of management and 9 budget based on standards and specifications established by the 10 secretary of state. Equipment shall not be purchased or leased 11 until an appropriation for the equipment has been made by the 12 legislature. - after a budget request has been properly presented 13 to the legislature. The A photograph TAKEN PURSUANT TO THIS 14 SECTION shall appear on the applicant's driver's OPERATOR'S OR 15 CHAUFFEUR'S license only and -a- THE photograph, A COPY OF THE 16 PHOTOGRAPH, or A negative of the photograph shall not be -kept on 17 file RETAINED by the secretary of state or any other 18 -enforcement- agency.
- (3) An application shall be signed and certified by the 20 applicant. An application shall be accompanied by the proper 21 fee. to THIS FEE SHALL be collected by the examiner and for-22 warded to the secretary of state with the application. This fee 23 shall be refunded to the applicant when IF the license applied 24 for is denied, but the fee shall not be refunded to an applicant 25 who fails to complete the examination requirements of the secretary of state within 90 days after the date of application for a 27 license.

- 1 (4) If an application is received from a person previously
  2 licensed in another jurisdiction, the secretary of state shall
  3 request a copy of the applicant's record from the other
  4 jurisdiction. When received, the driving record shall become a
  5 part of the driver's record in this state with the same force and
  6 effect as though entered on the driver's record in this state in
  7 the original instance. If the application is for an original,
  8 renewal, or change of a vehicle group designation or indorsement,
  9 the secretary of state shall also check the applicant's driving
  10 record with the national drivers register and the United States
  11 department of transportation before issuance of that group designation
- (5) Except for a vehicle group designation or indorsement,

  14 the secretary of state may issue a renewal operator's or

  15 chauffeur's license for 1 additional 4-year period by mail.

  16 The EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION, THE secretary

  17 of state shall not issue a renewal license by mail unless the

  18 licensee IS LESS THAN 71 YEARS OF AGE AND has a driving record

  19 which is free of convictions and civil infraction determinations

  20 for the 48 months preceding renewal. However, the secretary of

  21 state shall not refuse to issue a renewal license by mail because

  22 of a conviction or civil infraction determination for which fines

  23 and costs were waived pursuant to section 901a or section 907.
- 24 (6) A LICENSEE WHO IS 71 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER MAY RENEW HIS
  25 OR HER OPERATOR'S OR CHAUFFEUR'S LICENSE BY MAIL IF, IN ADDITION
  26 TO MEETING ALL OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL UNDER THIS ACT, THE
  27 LICENSEE HAS COMPLETED AN ACCIDENT PREVENTION EDUCATION COURSE

12 nation or indorsement.

- 1 WITHIN 6 MONTHS BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE LICENSE AND
- 2 SUBMITS A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION OF THE COURSE WITH HIS OR HER
- 3 APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL. THE ACCIDENT PREVENTION EDUCATION
- 4 COURSE SHALL MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:
- 5 (A) THE COURSE SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, ALL OF
- 6 THE FOLLOWING:
- 7 (i) A MINIMUM OF 8 HOURS OF CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION.
- 8 (ii) A REVIEW OF ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 9 (A) THE EFFECTS OF AGING ON DRIVING BEHAVIOR.
- 10 (B) THE SHAPES, COLORS, AND TYPES OF ROAD SIGNS.
- (C) THE EFFECTS OF ALCOHOL AND MEDICATION ON DRIVING.
- 12 (D) THE LAWS RELATING TO THE PROPER USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE.
- (E) ACCIDENT PREVENTION MEASURES.
- 14 (F) THE BENEFITS OF SAFETY BELTS AND CHILD RESTRAINTS.
- 15 (G) MAJOR DRIVING HAZARDS.
- 16 (H) INTERACTION WITH OTHER HIGHWAY USERS SUCH AS MOTORCY-
- 17 CLISTS, BICYCLISTS, AND PEDESTRIANS.
- 18 (iii) PSYCHO-PHYSICAL TESTING, INCLUDING DEPTH PERCEPTION,
- 19 BRAKE REACTION TIME, AND NIGHT VISION.
- 20 (B) A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION SHALL BE ISSUED TO A PERSON
- 21 WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES THE COURSE.
- 22 (7) ALONG WITH THE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL PROVIDED TO A
- 23 LICENSEE, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION CON-
- 24 CERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF ACCIDENT PREVENTION EDUCATION COURSES
- 25 AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (6).
- (8) When a license is renewed by mail, the secretary of
- 27 state shall issue evidence of renewal, which shall be affixed to

- I the previously issued license to indicate the date the license
- 2 expires in the future. This -evidentiary document EVIDENCE OF
- 3 RENEWAL shall be manufactured in the same manner required of the
- 4 operator's license in section 310 of this act. A MANNER TO PRO-
- 5 HIBIT AS NEARLY AS POSSIBLE THE ABILITY TO REPRODUCE, ALTER,
- 6 COUNTERFEIT, FORGE, OR DUPLICATE IT WITHOUT READY DETECTION.
- 7 (9) -(6) Upon request, the secretary of state shall provide
- 8 an information manual to an applicant explaining how to obtain a
- 9 vehicle group designation or indorsement. The manual shall con-
- 10 tain the information required pursuant to 49 C.F.R. part 383.
