HOUSE BILL No. 5019

July 28, 1989, Introduced by Rep. Niederstadt and referred to the Committee on Towns and Counties.

A bill to amend section 3 of Act No. 132 of the Public Acts of 1970, entitled

"An act to provide for the filing of surveys in the office of the register of deeds relative to land divisions; and to prescribe the conditions of the survey,"

as amended by Act No. 24 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 54.213 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 3 of Act No. 132 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1970, as amended by Act No. 24 of the Public Acts of 1988, being
- 3 section 54.213 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Sec. 3. (1) The map shall be prepared on durable white
- 6 paper 8-1/2 inches wide by 14 inches long. All lines LINES ON
- 7 A MAP shall be made with nonfading black ink on a scale of not
- 8 more than 500 feet to an inch -, and shown thereon, or, instead

- 1 of the above, the SHOWN ON THE MAP. THE map may INSTEAD be
- 2 prepared on tracing cloth or paper, and a true scale -photostat,
- 3 or microfilm record REPRODUCTION of the map PURSUANT TO THE
- 4 RECORDS MEDIA ACT may be recorded. -and- THE MAP shall include
- 5 all of the following:
- 6 (a) A certificate signed and sealed by the licensed land
- 7 surveyor who surveyed and mapped the parcel or parcels, typed,
- 8 lettered, or reproduced legibly with nonfading ink, giving a
- 9 clear concise description of the land surveyed by bearings and
- 10 distances, commencing with some corner marked and established in
- 11 the United States public land survey, or reestablished in accord-
- 12 ance with accepted methods. The certificate shall also include
- 13 the ratio of closure of latitudes and departures, which shall be
- 14 within limits accepted by the profession of land surveying, and
- 15 certification by the licensed land surveyor that the requirements
- 16 of this section have been met.
- (b) The exterior boundaries of the land surveyed and divid-
- 18 ed, together with the line or lines leading to the United States
- 19 public land survey corner, or corners, from which the land is
- 20 described. -Boundaries A BOUNDARY along a lake or stream shall
- 21 be defined by a meander line connecting the side boundaries of
- 22 the parcel. If a lot in a recorded subdivision is divided, the
- 23 exterior boundaries of the lot surveyed and divided shall be ref-
- 24 erenced to existing lot corners and the controlling monuments
- 25 used for that survey.
- (c) If the boundary of the parcel follows or parallels a
- 27 section line, the section line shall be defined at its

- 1 extremities by a corner established in the United States public
- 2 land survey or reestablished in accordance with accepted
- 3 methods. All corners EACH CORNER of the United States public
- 4 land survey shall be duly witnessed to A permanent objects,
- 5 OBJECT and THE kind of object and the bearings and distances
- 6 -thereto TO IT, together with the kind and material of monumen-
- 7 tation marking the corner, shall be shown on the map.
- 8 (d) Curved boundaries A CURVED BOUNDARY or A curved high-
- 9 way, street, -lines and OR lot -lines, when LINE, IF the curve
- 10 is contained within the line, shall be defined by the points of
- 11 curvature and tangency and compound curvature, central angle,
- 12 length of arcs, degree of curvature, AND length and bearing of
- 13 the long chord, or, when IF THE CURVE IS only partially con-
- 14 tained within the line, by the length of arc along the curve,
- 15 degree of curvature, AND length and bearing of the short chord,
- 16 or by traverse courses and distances -where- IF the curve is not
- 17 regular.
- (e) If the AN exterior boundary lines show bearings or
- 19 lengths which vary from those LINE SHOWS A BEARING OR LENGTH
- 20 THAT VARIES FROM THAT recorded in AN abutting -plats PLAT or
- 21 certified surveys, there shall be SURVEY, the following note
- 22 SHALL BE placed along such lines THE LINE "recorded as (show
- 23 bearings BEARING or lengths LENGTH or both)".
- 24 (f) Lengths and bearings of all lines THE LENGTH AND BEAR-
- 25 ING OF EACH LINE.

- 1 (g) Exact widths of streets, highways, alleys, and
- 2 easements THE EXACT WIDTH OF EACH STREET, HIGHWAY, ALLEY, AND
- 3 EASEMENT.
- 4 (h) Distances on boundaries THE DISTANCE ON A BOUNDARY or
- 5 lot -lines LINE from the point of intersection with a meander
- 6 line to apparent ordinary high water line of Great Lakes waters
- 7 and to the water's edge of inland lakes and streams.
- 8 (i) A north point properly located. thereon.
- 9 (2) (j) Certified survey maps prepared in accordance with
- 10 this section shall be accepted, upon payment of the regular fee
- 11 schedule as provided in section 2567(1)(a) of the revised judica-
- 12 ture act of 1961, Act No. 236 of the Public Acts of 1961, being
- 13 section 600.2567 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and SHALL BE
- 14 numbered consecutively by the register of deeds, -and shall be
- 15 recorded in bound volumes, or in a manner adapted to a
- 16 microfilm system of preserving records PURSUANT TO THE RECORDS
- 17 MEDIA ACT, and known as the "certified survey maps of
- 18 county", and shall become a part of the land
- 19 records thereof, and a OF THE COUNTY. A separate card file
- 20 shall be kept showing by section, township, and range and also by
- 21 title of recorded plat if a resurvey within such plat, the desig-
- 22 nating number liber and page of the certified maps filed in the
- 23 bound volume, or microfilm OTHER record.
- 24 (3) (k) If a certified survey map has been IS recorded
- 25 in accordance with this section, the parcels of land in the map
- 26 may be described with a supplemental reference to the number of
- 27 the survey, the volume and page where recorded, and the name of

- 1 the county, for all purposes, including assessment, taxation,
- 2 devise, descent, and conveyance.
- 3 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
- 4 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 5013 (request
- 5 no. 03301'89) of the 85th Legislature is enacted into law.
