

# HOUSE BILL No. 5480

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 14, 1990, Introduced by Reps. Jacobetti and Maynard and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police, and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of such reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide testing of certain persons; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

21 Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of article  
 22 IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in this bill is

12 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each department  
 13 that state spending to local units of government will be less than the amount  
 14 that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the principal executive  
 15 officer shall immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the  
 16 department of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations  
 17 committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.

18 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized under  
 19 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and  
 20 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to the  
 21 management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, as amended,  
 22 being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

23 Sec. 203. As used in this act:

24 (a) "AFIS" means automated fingerprint identification system.

25 (b) "AIS/ICF/MR" means alternate intermediate services, intermediate  
 26 care facilities, mentally retarded.

(c) "CARE" means combined accident reduction effort.

(d) "CCD" or "consolidated central dispatch" means an entity consisting of 75% or more of the law enforcement, fire fighting, and emergency service agencies, or those agencies encompassing 75% or more of the population of the service area, joined under a written agreement to operate under a single dispatching operation. The 75% requirements for a CCD may be waived in counties of over 250,000 where other configurations promise effective and efficient services. A CCD must also include all of the following:

(i) The participation of the county sheriff and the state police.

(ii) The control of central dispatching by a countywide or regional authority consisting of representatives of participating jurisdictions and agencies and the general public, that selects supervisory staff and oversees operations.

(iii) One or 2 dispatching points operated by the authority as is determined to be necessary given the size of the county.

(iv) Dispatch services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, year-round to all participating jurisdictions and agencies.

(v) A written agreement including an annual budget by the participant that specifies the nature and amount of service and identifies sources of financing, including the provision of personnel, equipment, supplies, and funds from participants or dedicated sources.

(vi) An operational policy based on the concept of the dispatch of the closest unit, of the appropriate type, to the service request.

(vii) Operation using 9-1-1, or enhanced 9-1-1, under the emergency telephone service enabling act, Act No. 32 of the Public Acts of 1986, being sections 484.1101 to 484.1707 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, where feasible.

2 (e) "CCH" means computerized criminal history.

3 (f) "Department" means the department of state police.

4 (g) "DMB" means the Michigan department of management and budget.

5 (h) "DOD" means United States department of defense.

6 (i) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

7 (j) "DOJ-BJS" means the United States department of justice, bureau of  
8 justice statistics.

9 (k) "DOT" means the United States department of transportation.

10 (l) "DOT-NHTSA" means DOT-national highway traffic safety administration.

11 (m) "FTE" means full-time equated.

12 (n) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

13 (o) "IBT" means intradepartmental transfer.

14 (p) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

15 (q) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

16 (r) "MDOT" means Michigan department of transportation.

17 (s) "MLEOTC" means the Michigan law enforcement officer training council.

18 (t) "OHSP" means office of highway safety planning.

19 (u) "Title XVIII" means title XVIII of the Social Security Act of 1935  
20 as amended.

21 Sec. 204. The appropriations provided in section 101 for salaries and  
22 wages, longevity and insurance, retirement, and pension, and for project  
23 accounts are approved for expenditure for automated information processing  
24 which is relevant to the objectives of the given appropriation unit or project  
25 account. Such expenditure shall not be applied to the \$20,000.00 limitation  
26 provided in section 203(2) of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of

1 the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1203 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

2       Sec. 205. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion of  
3 contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for utility service  
4 to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a manner consistent with  
5 the provisions of section 253 of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of  
6 the Public Acts of 1984, as amended, being section 18.1253 of the Michigan  
7 Compiled Laws.

8 EXECUTIVE DIRECTION

9       Sec. 301. Funds appropriated in section 101 for rental of department  
10 aircraft shall be considered a work project account and shall not lapse at the  
11 end of the fiscal year.

12 DEPARTMENTWIDE APPROPRIATIONS

13       Sec. 401. Expenditures of federal, local, state restricted, or private  
14 allotments from the amounts appropriated in section 101 for federal, local,  
15 state restricted, and private assistance for state police services shall not  
16 be made until after review by the department of management and budget and the  
17 state police subcommittees of the senate and house appropriations committees.  
18 If a request for review is not acted upon within 45 days after the date of  
19 submission to the state police subcommittees of the senate and house  
20 appropriations committees, the department may expend the allotment.

21       Sec. 402. (2) The department shall submit an annual report on November 1,  
22 1990 on the allocations and expenditures of the \$500,000.00 appropriated in  
23 section 101 to departmentwide appropriations for narcotic investigation funds.

24       Sec. 403. (1) Pursuant to the provisions of civil service rules and  
25 regulations and applicable collective bargaining agreements, individuals  
26 seeking employment with the department shall submit to a controlled substance

1 test. The test shall be administered by the department.

2 (2) Individuals seeking employment with the department who refuse to take  
3 a controlled substance test or who test positive for the illicit use of a  
4 controlled substance on such a test shall be denied employment by the  
5 department for a minimum of 1 year.

6 (3) Funds shall not be expended by the MLEOTC for training law  
7 enforcement officer candidates, nor shall a candidate be certified by the  
8 MLEOTC, unless he or she tests negative on a test designed to detect the  
9 illicit use of a controlled substance. The test shall be conducted prior to  
10 basic training or application for certification. A candidate who tests  
11 positive or refuses to submit to the testing shall not be eligible for MLEOTC  
12 certification for a minimum of 2 years.

13 (4) From the funds available in section 101, sufficient money is provided  
14 to maintain the substance abuse data base as provided for in the MLEOTC  
15 substance abuse testing program.

16 (5) The fire fighters training council shall consider requiring all new  
17 fire fighter candidates to submit to controlled substance testing procedures  
18 developed by the fire fighters training council and administered at the local  
19 level. At the discretion of the fire fighters training council, candidates  
20 may be required to pay the cost of a controlled substance test required by the  
21 fire fighters training council. Candidates who refuse to submit to a  
22 controlled substance test as may be required by the fire fighters training  
23 council, or who test positive for the illicit use of a controlled substance on  
24 such a test, shall not be eligible for certification as a fire fighter for a  
25 minimum of 2 years.

26 HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING

1       Sec. 501. (1) The amounts appropriated in section 101 for highway safety  
2 planning programs shall be treated as work project accounts and shall not  
3 revert to the general fund of the state at the conclusion of the fiscal year  
4 ending September 30, 1991, but shall continue to be available for expenditure  
5 until the projects for which they were appropriated are completed or otherwise  
6 terminated. At the conclusion of the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991,  
7 the unencumbered balance for each completed or terminated project shall revert  
8 to the general fund and unearned federal funds received for the completed or  
9 terminated project shall be returned.

10       (2) A principal executive officer of a department having an appropriation  
11 for highway safety planning funds shall notify the state budget director as to  
12 the September 30, 1991, status of each project for which appropriations are  
13 made. This notification shall be made by the following November 1, 1991, and  
14 shall be in sufficient detail so that the state budget director can cause the  
15 unencumbered balance of the completed or terminated projects to be reverted to  
16 the general fund of the state.

17 CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER

18       Sec. 601. (1) The funds appropriated in section 101 for the automated  
19 fingerprint identification system shall be considered a work project account  
20 that shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

21       (2) In addition to appropriations contained in section 101, the  
22 department may receive and expend funds from local units of government  
23 pursuant to section 7 of A.F.I.S. policy council act, Act No. 307 of the  
24 Public Acts of 1988, being section 28.157 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, for  
25 the purpose of acquiring equipment for the automated fingerprint  
26 identification system.

1       Sec. 602. (1) The appropriations in section 101 include funds for the  
2 purchase of AFIS equipment.

3       (2) Funds expended by the department for the purchase of AFIS equipment  
4 for local consortiums shall be on a per capita basis.

5       (3) State funds shall not be used in the operations or maintenance of  
6 AFIS equipment for local consortiums.

7       Sec. 603. From the \$1,766,400.00 appropriated in section 101 for AFIS,  
8 an amount not to exceed \$260,000.00 may be used for the state share of local  
9 AFIS equipment. The total state share for this purpose shall not exceed  
10 \$1,660,000.00 over the 4-year lease-purchase period. The per capita rate to  
11 be established by the AFIS policy council shall not exceed a 4-year total of  
12 \$41,000.00 per 100,000 population. State funds shall be limited to the  
13 purchase of AFIS terminals that are on a 4-year lease-purchase basis. The  
14 state share shall not exceed 75%.

15       Sec. 604. In addition to the appropriations contained in section 101,  
16 the department may receive funds from local units of government for the  
17 purpose of expanding or upgrading the law enforcement information network, if  
18 the funds do not require state money either for matching purposes or for  
19 continuing programs if the funds from local units of government become  
20 unavailable.

21       Sec. 605. The \$1,823,100.00 appropriated in section 101 for a new  
22 computer shall be used for the lease/purchase and contract maintenance of a  
23 new mainframe computer which shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to  
24 pay 1/3 of the purchase, installation, and contract maintenance costs.

25       Sec. 606. (1) The state budget director is authorized to make  
26 administrative transfers of the unexpended general fund-general purpose

1 amounts available from amounts appropriated in section 101 to a special work  
2 project account for office automation in the department.

3 (2) The department shall certify to DMB by November 8, 1991 projected  
4 unexpended account balances available for transfer under the authority of  
5 subsection (1).

6 (3) The department of management and budget shall report to the house and  
7 senate appropriations committees the listing of all administrative transfers  
8 made under the authority of subsection (1).

9 EMERGENCY SERVICES

10 Sec. 701. (1) The state director of emergency services may expend funds  
11 appropriated under this act to call upon all agencies or departments of the  
12 state and all resources of the state for the purpose of protecting life and  
13 property and providing for the health and safety of the population in any area  
14 of the state in which the governor proclaims a state of emergency under Act  
15 No. 302 of the Public Acts of 1945, being sections 10.31 to 10.33 of the  
16 Michigan Compiled Laws, or under the emergency preparedness act, Act No. 390  
17 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections 30.401 to 30.420 of the Michigan  
18 Compiled Laws. The state director of emergency services may expend the  
19 amounts the director considers necessary to accomplish these purposes. The  
20 director shall submit to the state budget director as soon as possible a  
21 complete report of all actions taken under the authority of this section. The  
22 report shall contain as a separate item a statement of all funds expended that  
23 are not reimbursable from federal funds. The state budget director shall  
24 review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the legislature in  
25 regard to any possible need for a supplemental appropriation.

26 (2) In addition to the appropriations contained in section 101, the



1 department may receive and expend funds from local or private sources for the  
2 purpose of providing emergency management training to local or private  
3 interests.

4 (3) In addition to appropriations contained in section 101, the  
5 department may receive or expend funds from local or private sources for the  
6 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness response and mitigation activity.

#### 7 UNIFORM SERVICES

8 Sec. 801. It is the intent of the legislature that the appropriations in  
9 section 101 shall support an at post trooper strength of at least 1,252. The  
10 authorized at-post trooper strength consists of 1,060.0 FTE positions in the  
11 at-post troopers appropriation, 105.0 FTE positions in the general police  
12 services appropriation, and 100.0 FTE positions in the highway safety  
13 enforcement program for a total of 1,265.0 FTE positions. The at-post trooper  
14 appropriation also contains 60.0 FTE positions for overtime associated with  
15 the above identified 1,265.0 FTE positions.

16 Sec. 802. (1) Funds appropriated in section 101 for 9-1-1 consolidated  
17 central dispatch shall be for new equipment, continuation funding of existing  
18 consolidated central dispatches, new consolidated central dispatches that meet  
19 the definition criteria of a consolidated central dispatch established by the  
20 department and the June 2, 1988 central dispatch state plan recommendations of  
21 the office of criminal justice emergency telephone services committee, and for  
22 additional county dispatches that meet that criteria. Funds for new  
23 equipment, continuation funding of existing consolidated dispatches, new  
24 consolidated central dispatches, and additional county dispatches shall be  
25 expended in accordance with the guidelines established by the department and  
26 the April 4, 1989 office of criminal justice ad hoc subcommittee

1 recommendations. These funds shall be considered a work project account and  
2 shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year. The funding formula for new  
3 consolidated central dispatches shall use a rate not to exceed the state radio  
4 dispatcher FTE pay rate exclusively for, and limited to, dispatchers, dispatch  
5 supervisors, and center director personnel.

6 (2) Any county receiving state funds for consolidated central dispatches  
7 prior to the effective date of this act may receive funding according to the  
8 consolidated central dispatch formula described in subsection (1).

#### 9 INVESTIGATIVE SERVICES

10 Sec. 901. (1) The funds appropriated in section 101 for federal anti-drug  
11 initiatives shall be limited to operations that include significant financial  
12 and personnel participation from local units of government. State funds may  
13 be utilized to maximize federal fund matching for antidrug initiatives.

#### 14 MOTOR CARRIER ENFORCEMENT

15 Sec. 1001. There are sufficient funds appropriated in section 101 for  
16 the department, in an effort to provide greater enforcement of motor carrier  
17 laws, to continue on a limited basis the program initiated in the fiscal year  
18 ending September 30, 1989 in which troopers are certified as both troopers and  
19 motor carrier officers and enforce all laws of the state, including the motor  
20 carrier laws and regulations. The department shall maintain logs of its  
21 activities in order to continue to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages  
22 of this program.
