HOUSE BILL No. 5481

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 14, 1990, Introduced by Reps. Jacobetti and Owen and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of military affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain duties of the department of military affairs; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of military affairs, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991, from the funds identified as follows:

- 4 (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each department
- 5 that state spending to local units of government will be less than the amount
- 6 that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the principal executive
- 7 officer shall immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the
- 8 department of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations
- 9 committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.
- 10 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized under
- 11 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and
- 12 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to the
- 13 management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being
- 14 sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
- 15 Sec. 203. As used in this act:
- 16 (a) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.
- 17 (b) "FTE" means full-time equated.
- 18 Sec. 204. The department of military affairs is authorized to utilize a
- 19 portion of the \$67,700.00 appropriated in section 101 for disbursing officers
- 20 to provide incentive payments to national guard recruiters as long as this
- 21 expenditure does not require a supplemental appropriation or transfer of
- 22 appropriations to this account.
- 23 Sec. 205. Pursuant to the DMA provisions of civil service rules and
- 24 regulations and applicable collective bargaining agreements, individuals
- 25 seeking employment with the department shall submit to a controlled substance
- 26 test. The test shall be administered by the department.

- 1 (2) Individuals seeking employment with the department who refuse to take
- 2 a controlled substance test or who test positive for the illicit use of a
- 3 controlled substance on such a test shall be denied employment by the
- 4 department for a minimum of 1 year.
- 5 Sec. 206. The department of military affairs shall cooperative with each
- 6 community to make the garrison training centers available for rental
- 7 activities within the local community where reasonable. The department may
- 8 charge a rental fee of not more than the actual cost to the department of
- 9 military affairs of renting the garrison training center including overtime
- 10 compensation, insurance coverage, and maintenance required.
- 11 Sec. 207. (1) The \$2,783,502.00 appropriated in section 101 for grants
- 12 to veterans service organizations shall be used only for salaries, wages,
- 13 related personnel costs, training, and equipment for accredited veteran
- 14 service advocacy officers and necessary support and managerial staff
- 15 Training shall be provided for service advocacy officers and shall be
- 16 conducted by accredited advocacy officers.
- 17 (2) To receive a grant from the funds appropriated in section 101, a
- 18 veterans service organization shall meet the following eligibility
- 19 requirements:
- 20 (a) Be congressionally chartered by the United States congress.
- 21 (b) Be an active participating member of the Michigan veterans
- 22 organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee and abide by its
- 23 rules, guidelines, and programs.
- 24 (c) Demonstrate the receipt of monetary or service support from its own
- 25 organization.
- 26 (d) Comply with the legislature's requirements of accounting audits, 04938'90

- 1 service work activity, accounting of recoveries, listing of volunteer hours,
- 2 budget requests, and other requirements specified by law.
- 3 (e) For a veterans service organization founded after September 30,
- 4 1989, be in operation and providing service to Michigan veterans for not less
- 5 than 2 years prior to receiving an initial state grant. During this 2-year
- 6 period of time, the organization shall file a listing of service work activity
- 7 and an accounting of recoveries with the senate and house fiscal agencies and
- 8 the senate and house subcommittees on military affairs on forms as described
- 9 by the Michigan veterans organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service
- 10 committee.
- 11 (3) A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the funds 12 appropriated in section 101 shall file with the department of military affairs
 - 3 by January 1, 1991 a certified accounting of expenditures of the funds
- 14 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1990, a listing of all
- 15 service work activity, an accounting of recoveries, a listing of volunteer
- 16 hours, and a detailed budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30,
- 17 1992. A veterans service organization receiving a grant from the funds
- 18 appropriated in section 101 shall use the forms recommended by the Michigan
- 19 veterans organizations' rehabilitation and veterans service committee for
- 20 filing reports required by this act. The department of military affairs shall
- 21 forward information required under this section to the senate and house fiscal
- 22 agencies and to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on military
- 23 affairs with the budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1992.
- 24 (4) The audit review board created in section 207(3) of Act No. 301 of
- 25 the Public Acts of 1988 shall review and monitor the grant eligibility
- 26 requirements in subsection 92) and the information required in subsection (3)

- 1 for effectiveness and efficiency upon request of the senate and house
- 2 appropriations subcommittees on military affairs.
- 3 (5) Automatic increases shall not be considered by the legislature for
- 4 the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1991. It is the intent of the
- 5 legislature that each veterans service organization's budget for the fiscal
- 6 year 1991-92 shall be judged individually based on upon program effectiveness
- 7 and efficiency.
- 8 Sec. 208 The \$1,750,000 appropriated in Section 1 for abandoned home
- 9 demolition shall be expended on the basis of criteria and procedures developed
- 10 by the neighborhood builders alliance in cooperation with the department of
- 11 military affairs.
- 12 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in section 101 for the military duty
- 13 contingency fund shall be used to fund nonfederally supported missions of the
- 14 national guard when called to state duty.
- 15 Sec. 210. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion of
- 16 contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for utility service
- 17 to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a manner consistent with
- 18 the provisions of section 253 of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of
- 19 the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
