A bill to regulate the temperature setting of certain water heaters; and to require certain persons to provide notice.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. A person who installs a new water heater in a
- 2 single family or multi-unit residential dwelling shall preset the
- 3 thermostat on the water heater no higher than 120 degrees
- 4 Fahrenheit or 49 degrees Celsius.
- 5 Sec. 2. Prior to a tenant taking occupancy in a rented or
- 6 leased single family or multi-unit residential dwelling, the
- 7 owner of the dwelling shall set the thermostat on the water
- 8 heater for the dwelling no higher than 120 degrees Fahrenheit or
- 9 49 degrees Celsius.
- 10 Sec. 3. A water heating system may have a temperature
- 11 setting higher than provided in sections 1 and 2 if the system is
- 12 designed to restrict the temperature of water at the point it

- 1 flows from the tap to not more than 120 degrees Fahrenheit or 49
 2 degrees Celsius.
- 3 Sec. 4. (1) The occupant of a residential dwelling may set
- 4 the thermostat on the water heater for the dwelling at a tempera-
- 5 ture higher than that allowed under this act.
- 6 (2) If the occupant resets the thermostat of the water
- 7 heater under subsection (1), the person regulated under section 1
- 8 or 2 shall not be liable for damages caused by the resetting of

- 20 Celsius may cause severe burns and result in excessive energy
