## **HOUSE BILL No. 5710**

May 3, 1990, Introduced by Rep. Stupak and referred to the Committee on Taxation.

A bill to amend section 1 of Act No. 214 of the Public Acts of 1899, entitled as amended

"An act to provide relief outside of the soldiers' home for honorably discharged indigent soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses and members of women's auxiliaries and the indigent wives, widows and minor children of such indigent or deceased soldiers, sailors, marines, nurses and members of women's auxiliaries, and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

as amended by Act No. 168 of the Public Acts of 1984, being section 35.21 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 1 of Act No. 214 of the Public Acts of

- Sec. 1. The county board of commissioners of each county
- 6 shall annually levy --- AND COLLECT AS PROVIDED BY LAW a tax -- not

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1 exceeding OF 1/10 of a mill on each dollar -, to be levied and 2 collected as provided by law, upon the taxable property of each 3 township and city, for their respective counties, THE COUNTY for 4 the purpose of creating a fund for the relief of honorably dis-5 charged indigent members of the army, navy, air force, marine 6 corps, coast guard, and women's auxiliaries of all wars or mili-7 tary expeditions in which the United States of America has 8 been, is , or -may hereafter be, WAS a participant as pre-9 scribed in section 1 of Act No. 190 of the Public Acts of 1965, 10 being section 35.61 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, and the indi-II gent spouses, minor children, and parents of -each such indigent 12 or deceased -member MEMBERS. Funds raised in accordance with 13 the provisions of this section may be expended for the relief of 14 indigent wives SPOUSES and children of active duty soldiers, 15 sailors, marines, airmen, coast quardsmen, nurses, and members of to the women's auxiliaries during the continuance of present hostil-17 ities and prior to their discharge. However, -in any year which, 18 in the opinion of the board, an emergency justifying the same 19 exists, the board may appropriate a sum not to exceed 2/10 of a 20 mill on each dollar for said purpose THE PURPOSES SET FORTH IN 21 THIS SECTION IN A YEAR IN WHICH, IN THE OPINION OF THE BOARD, AN 22 EMERGENCY JUSTIFYING SUCH AN APPROPRIATION EXISTS. The sums. 23 when collected - shall be paid to the county treasurer of 24 the county where such tax is levied in each of the counties in 25 this state, to AND SHALL be paid out by the treasurer upon the 26 order of the soldiers' relief commission duly signed by the 27 chairperson and secretary of the commission. If any money in the

- I fund is not necessary for the purpose for which it was raised,
- 2 the money shall remain in the treasury of the county as a
- 3 soldiers' relief fund. -, and shall be considered in raising
- 4 future sums therefor.

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
