## HOUSE BILL No. 5799

May 22, 1990, Introduced by Rep. Jacobetti and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend section 3 of Act No. 284 of the Public Acts of 1937, entitled as amended

"An act to prevent the spread of infectious and contagious diseases of livestock; to require persons, associations, partnerships and corporations engaged in the buying, receiving, selling, transporting, exchanging, negotiating, or soliciting sale, resale, exchange or transportation of livestock to be licensed and bonded by the department of agriculture; to keep a producers' proceeds account; to provide for the refusal, suspension or revocation of such licenses; to provide for weighmasters; to provide for the inspection and disinfection of yards, premises and vehicles; and to provide penalties for the violation of this act,"

being section 287.123 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 3 of Act No. 284 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1937, being section 287.123 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 3. (1) -Each- A dealer, broker, or agent -engaged in
- 5 such business for the purposes aforesaid shall file an

- 2 business. The application shall state the nature of the busi-
- 3 ness, the -postoffice POST-OFFICE address of the applicant and
- 4 the postoffice POST-OFFICE address at or from which the busi-

- 6 OPERATES a livestock yard where livestock is kept and sold at
- 7 public or private sale, the application shall so state. The
- 8 application may state such additional information as the director
- 9 of agriculture shall require REQUIRES. The application for
- 10 license to engage in the business of dealer, broker or agent -as
- 11 herein defined shall be accompanied by a license fee of \$5.00
- 12 \$100.00 payable to the director. of agriculture and deposited

- 16 (2) IN THE CASE OF livestock WHICH is purchased or sold by
- 17 weight, -such- THE licensees shall employ a registered weighmas-
- 18 ter who shall be required to do all TO PERFORM the weighing.
- 19 The duties, qualifications, and requirements for registration of
- 20 weighmasters shall be established by the director -of agriculture
- 21 under the provisions of section 9 of this act AS PROVIDED IN
- 22 SECTION 9. The application for such A WEIGHMASTER license and
- 23 bond shall be made to the director of agriculture on or before
- 24 October 1 of each year. -Each A license issued shall be for a
- 25 period of 1 year commencing October 1 and ending the following

(3) A dealer, broker, or agent operating or conducting a 2 livestock auction shall file with his OR HER LICENSE application 3 for a license and for the period for which such license shall be 4 issued a surety bond, COVERING THE PERIOD OF TIME FOR WHICH THE 5 LICENSE IS ISSUED, WRITTEN by a surety company registered in the 6 state of Michigan to indemnify persons from whom livestock is 7 purchased or for whom livestock is sold; or with such sureties 8 and PROVIDE SURETIES in such amounts, form, and sufficiency as 9 shall be approved by the director. of agriculture. The 10 amount of the bond shall be an amount equal to EQUAL the amount 11 of gross dollar volume of livestock business conducted during the 12 average week of the previous licensing year by the applicant, but 13 in no case NOT less than \$1,500.00. If the average gross 14 weekly livestock business conducted by the applicant during the 15 previous licensing year was greater than \$25,000.00, the bond 16 shall be increased above \$25,000.00, at the rate of \$1,000.00 for 17 each \$5,000.00 or part thereof above \$25,000.00 on the average 18 gross dollar-volume of weekly livestock business conducted during 19 the previous year. A licensee who owns or operates more than 1 20 livestock yard or livestock auction may file 1 bond in an amount 21 determined by the foregoing formula. Any FORMULA DESCRIBED IN 22 THIS SUBSECTION. A dealer, broker, or agent operating or con-23 ducting a livestock yard or livestock auction who has filed a 24 surety bond for -such- THE livestock yard or livestock auction 25 which indemnifies persons from whom livestock is purchased or for 26 whom livestock is sold in accordance with the terms of any 27 federal act shall be exempt from the bonding requirements of this

- 1 -section SUBSECTION provided IF the bond is equivalent in
- 2 amount to that TO THE AMOUNT which would be required by this
- 3 act. The bond shall be for a livestock dealer or broker and his
- 4 OR HER agents in which the department of agriculture shall be
- 5 the oblique but which shall be for the benefit and purpose of
- 6 protecting all persons selling or consigning livestock to such A
- 7 licensed dealer, broker, or agent against the licensed dealer's,
- 8 broker's, or agent's failure to pay amounts due on livestock pur-
- 9 chased by or consigned to them. Each-
- 10 (4) A licensee shall keep -such records and shall furnish
- 11 upon request -such information concerning his OR HER purchases
- 12 and sales as may be required by the director for the purpose of
- 13 establishing the amount of bond required -hereunder- UNDER THIS
- 14 SECTION. The director, in fixing the amount of the bond, shall
- 15 take into consideration the dollar volume of livestock business
- 16 and other information furnished by the livestock dealer, broker,
- 17 or his agent. If a dealer, broker, or agent did not operate a
- 18 livestock auction the previous licensing year, the bond shall be
- 19 for an amount as shall be established by the director after -his-
- 20 consideration of all information available to him OR HER on the
- 21 probable weekly gross dollar volume of business which will be
- 22 conducted by the dealer, broker, or agent during the licensing
- 23 year. If during any licensing year the bond filed by any
- 24 licensee becomes less than THE AMOUNT required by this act
- 25 because of an increase in gross dollar volume of livestock sales,
- 26 the director may require the licensee to file an additional bond
- 27 to cover the increase in gross dollar volume of livestock sales.

- 1 Failure OF THE LICENSEE to comply with the orders of the director
- 2 shall be reason for suspension or revocation of license. -Such-
- 3 THE bond shall be conditioned upon the faithful performance of
- 4 his THE duties as a dealer, and on UPON COMPLIANCE WITH the
- 5 provisions of law relating to the purchase of livestock by such
- 6 THE livestock dealer, and for the payment by -said THE livestock
- 7 dealer of all livestock purchased by or consigned to -such
- 8 livestock THE dealer as a dealer in livestock. The fees col
- 9 lected by the director of agriculture shall be turned over to the
- 10 state treasury and shall be credited to the general fund. The

- 12 (5) A license ISSUED UNDER THIS ACT shall entitle the holder
- 13 -thereof to conduct the business of dealer or broker -as defined
- 14 in this act at or from the place named in the application, -:
- 15 Provided, however, That every EXCEPT THAT A business, associa-
- 16 tion, partnership, or corporation engaged in the business of
- 17 transporting livestock, or negotiating or soliciting the trans-
- 18 portation or transfer of livestock, and who shall not be IS NOT
- 19 engaged in the buying, selling, reselling, exchanging, or
- 20 negotiating, or soliciting THE sale, resale, or exchange of
- 21 -such livestock, shall be required to obtain the A license
- 22 provided for in this section but shall not be. IS NOT required
- 23 to comply with bonding provisions of this act.
- 24 (6) Every- A dealer, broker, or agent shall keep adequate
- 25 records of the producers' proceeds account as -defined DESCRIBED
- 26 in section 3a -of this act and of all sales and purchases for a
- 27 period of 2 years in such manner as -shall be- required by the

- 1 director, of agriculture, and which records shall be open to
- 2 inspection by the department. -of agriculture. Any A dealer,
- 3 broker, or agent, upon change of address, shall notify the direc-
- 4 tor of such change of address THE CHANGE within 5 days. Any
- 5 A change in ownership of -any A livestock auction -or market-
- 6 shall be reported to the director within 5 days by the licensee.
- 7 Each A dealer or broker shall file with the director on January
- 8 1 of each year a sworn statement of average weekly sales and a
- 9 statement showing the number and kinds of livestock purchased and
- 10 sold during the previous year.
