A bill to amend sections 2237 and 2269 of Act No. 218 of the Public Acts of 1956, entitled as amended "The insurance code of 1956," section 2269 as added by Act No. 195 of the Public Acts of 1982, being sections 500.2237 and 500.2269 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Sections 2237 and 2269 of Act No. 218 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1956, section 2269 as added by Act No. 195 of the
- 3 Public Acts of 1982, being sections 500.2237 and 500.2269 of the
- 4 Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 2237. No A policy of insurance issued under the
- 6 provisions of chapters 34 and 36 of this act, to take effect
- 7 after June 30, 1962, CHAPTER 34 OR 36 shall NOT contain any
- 8 provision restricting the liability of the insurer with respect

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- 1 to expenses, for which payment would be legally required in the
- 2 absence of insurance, on the ground that -such THOSE expenses
- 3 were incurred while the person insured is in a hospital,
- 4 institution, or other facility operated by the state or a politi-
- 5 cal subdivision thereof OF THE STATE OR ON THE GROUND THAT
- 6 THOSE EXPENSES WERE INCURRED WHILE THE PERSON INSURED IS IN A
- 7 HOSPITAL, INSTITUTION, OR OTHER FACILITY THAT IS NOT ACCREDITED
- 8 BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF HOSPITALS.
- 9 Sec. 2269. (1) "Accident", "accidental injury", or
- 10 "accidental means" shall be defined in accordance with the
- 11 following:
- 12 (a) The definition shall not include words which THAT
- 13 establish an accidental means test or use words such as
- 14 "external, violent, visible wounds" or similar words of descrip-
- 15 tion or characterization.
- (b) The definition may provide that injuries shall not
- 17 include injuries for which benefits are provided under any
- 18 worker's compensation, employer's liability, or similar law,
- 19 unless prohibited by law.
- 20 (2) "Benefit period" or "medicare benefit period" shall not
- 21 be defined in a more restrictive manner than as defined in the
- 22 medicare program.
- (3) "Hospital" may be defined in relation to its status,
- 24 facilities, and available services or to reflect its accredit
- 25 ation by the joint commission on accreditation of hospitals, and
- 26 in accordance with the following:

- 1 (a) The definition shall not be more restrictive than to
- 2 require that the hospital meets all of the following
- 3 requirements:
- 4 (i) Be an institution operated pursuant to law.
- 5 (ii) Be primarily and continuously engaged in providing or
- 6 operating, either on its premises or in facilities available to
- 7 the hospital on a prearranged basis and under the supervision of
- 8 a staff of duly licensed physicians, medical, diagnostic, and
- 9 surgical facilities for the medical care and treatment of sick or
- 10 injured persons on an inpatient basis for which a charge is
- 11 made.
- 12 (iii) Provide 24-hour nursing service by or under the super-
- 13 vision of registered professional nurses.
- (b) The definition may provide that the term shall not
- 15 include 1 or more of the following:
- (i) Convalescent homes or convalescent, rest, or nursing
- 17 facilities.
- 18 (ii) Facilities primarily affording custodial or educational
- 19 care.
- 20 (iii) Facilities for the aged.
- (iv) Any military or veterans hospital or soldiers home or
- 22 any hospital contracted for or operated by any national govern-
- 23 ment or agency -thereof OF A NATIONAL GOVERNMENT for the treat-
- 24 ment of members or ex-members of the armed forces, except for
- 25 services rendered on an emergency basis where a legal liability
- 26 exists for charges made to the individual for those services.

- 1 (C) THE DEFINITION SHALL NOT PROVIDE THAT THE HOSPITAL MUST
- 2 BE ACCREDITED BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF
- 3 HOSPITALS.

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
