

HOUSE BILL No. 6240

November 8, 1990, Introduced by Reps. Alley, DeMars, Dolan and Kosteva and referred to the Committee on Conservation, Recreation and Environment.

A bill to amend section 7 of Act No. 101 of the Public Acts of 1985, entitled "Michigan natural resources trust fund act," being section 318.507 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 7 of Act No. 101 of the Public Acts of
2 1985, being section 318.507 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 7. (1) The Michigan natural resources trust fund board
5 is established within the department. The department shall offer
6 its cooperation and aid to the board and shall provide suitable
7 offices and equipment for the board.

8 (2) The board shall consist of 5 members. The members shall
9 include the director of the department of natural resources or a
10 member of the commission of ~~natural resources~~ CONSERVATION AND

1 RECREATION, as determined by the commission of ~~natural~~
2 ~~resources~~ CONSERVATION AND RECREATION, and 4 residents of the
3 state to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent
4 of the senate.

5 (3) The terms of the appointive members shall be 4 years,
6 except that of those first appointed, 1 shall be appointed for 1
7 year, 1 shall be appointed for 2 years, 1 shall be appointed for
8 3 years, and 1 shall be appointed for 4 years.

9 (4) The appointive members may be removed by the governor
10 for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office.

11 (5) Vacancies on the board shall be filled for the unexpired
12 term in the same manner as the original appointments.

13 (6) The board may incur expenses necessary to carry out its
14 powers and duties under this act and shall compensate its members
15 for actual expenses incurred in carrying out their official
16 duties.

17 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
18 all of the following bills of the 85th Legislature are enacted
19 into law:
