HOUSE BILL No. 4756

May 3, 1989, Introduced by Rep. Honigman and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend section 6 of Act No. 355 of the Public Acts of 1927, entitled

"An act to provide for the appointment of a board of commissioners who shall have the management and control of the Mackinac Island state park, defining its powers and duties; and to repeal Act No. 222 of the Public Acts of 1895,"

being section 318.66 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 charged with the execution of such rules and regulations for the 2 care and preservation of the park, and the property in and about 3 the fort, as may be prescribed in rules duly formulated by the 4 -said- board. Such special police shall be vested with the 5 authority of sheriffs of -said THE island, and may apprehend and 6 arrest, without warrant, any person whom they may find violating 7 the rules which shall have been published relative to good order, 8 the preservation of property, the mutilation of landmarks, or the 9 destruction or injury to growing trees and shrubs. - Said THE 10 special police are authorized to make complaint against offenders 11 against the rules of the government of -said- Mackinac Island 12 state park, before THE DISTRICT COURT HAVING JURISDICTION. - any 13 justice of the peace of the township of Holmes, and said justice 14 or justices of the peace are hereby authorized to take cogni-15 zance, hear, try and determine such complaints and pass sentence 16 upon such offenders, in accordance with said rules and the proper 17 enforcement thereof, and in accordance with justice.
