A bill to amend the title and sections 1, 2, 6, 9, and 10 of Act No. 287 of the Public Acts of 1969, entitled
"An act to regulate pet shops, dog pounds and animal shelters,"
section 1 as amended by Act No. 214 of the Public Acts of 1980,
being sections 287.331, 287.332, 287.336, 287.339, and 287.340 of
the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add section 8a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. The title and sections 1, 2, 6, 9, and 10 of Act
- 2 No. 287 of the Public Acts of 1969, section 1 as amended by Act
- 3 No. 214 of the Public Acts of 1980, being sections 287.331,
- 4 287.332, 287.336, 287.339, and 287.340 of the Michigan Compiled
- 5 Laws, are amended and section 8a is added to read as follows:

- 2 An act to regulate pet shops, dog pounds, and animal

- (C) -(d) "Animal shelter" means a facility, OTHER THAN A
- 20 DOG POUND, operated by a person, humane society, A society for
- 21 the prevention of cruelty to animals, or any other nonprofit
- 22 organization A PERSON, for the care of homeless animals, ANIMALS
- 23 THAT ARE HELD DUE TO THE VIOLATION OF A MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE OR
- 24 STATE LAW, OR ANIMALS SURRENDERED TO THE FACILITY.
- 25 (D) "CAT" MEANS A LIVE DOMESTIC CAT OF THE SPECIES FELIS
- 26 CATUS.

- 3 (F) "DOG POUND" MEANS A FACILITY OPERATED BY A MUNICIPALITY

- 5 LARGE, ANIMALS THAT ARE OTHERWISE HELD DUE TO THE VIOLATION OF A

- 8 (G) (e) "Health certificate" means a certificate in a form

- 20 (K) "SPAY-NEUTER CLINIC" MEANS A FACILITY, OPERATED BY A
- 21 HUMANE SOCIETY, MUNICIPALITY, OR A PRIVATE VETERINARY CLINIC CON-
- 22 TRACTING WITH A HUMANE SOCIETY OR A MUNICIPALITY, FOR THE PER-

- 25 Sec. 2. The agriculture EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN

- 5 AGE OR OLDER OR A FEMALE 6 MONTHS OF AGE OR OLDER. IF THE DOG OR
- 6 CAT TO BE ADOPTED IS A MALE UNDER 9 MONTHS OF AGE OR A FEMALE
- 7 UNDER 6 MONTHS OF AGE, THE CONTRACT SHALL CONTAIN THE DATE UPON
- 8 WHICH THE MALE DOG OR CAT WILL REACH 9 MONTHS OF AGE OR THE
- 9 FEMALE DOG OR CAT WILL REACH 6 MONTHS OF AGE, AND SHALL REQUIRE
- 10 THE PERSON ADOPTING THE DOG OR CAT TO HAVE AN ALTERATION PER-
- 11 FORMED ON THE DOG OR CAT WITHIN 2 WEEKS AFTER THAT DATE.
- 12 (3) A CONTRACT ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) SHALL
- 13 REQUIRE THE ADOPTING PERSON TO LEAVE WITH THE DOG POUND OR ANIMAL
- 14 SHELTER A GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT OF \$15.00 FOR THE PROMISE OF THE
- 15 PERFORMANCE OF AN ALTERATION ON THE DOG OR CAT ADOPTED WITHIN THE
- 16 TIME STATED IN SUBSECTION (2). IF THE PERSON FAILS TO COMPLY
- 17 WITH THE TERMS OF THE CONTRACT, HE OR SHE SHALL FORFEIT THE
- 18 \$15.00 DEPOSIT. ALL MONEY FORFEITED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION
- 19 SHALL BE USED BY THE DOG POUND OR ANIMAL SHELTER TO FINANCE
- 20 PUBLIC EDUCATION REGARDING THE VALUE OF HAVING ALTERATIONS PER-
- 21 FORMED ON CATS AND DOGS.
- 22 (4) IF THE ADOPTING PERSON COMPLIES WITH THE TERMS OF THE
- 23 CONTRACT ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1), THE GOOD FAITH
- 24 DEPOSIT OF \$15.00 SHALL BE REFUNDED BY THE DOG POUND OR ANIMAL
- 25 SHELTER UPON SUBMISSION BY THE ADOPTING PERSON OF WRITTEN CERTI-
- 26 FICATION BY A LICENSED VETERINARIAN THAT AN ALTERATION WAS
- 27 PERFORMED ON THE ADOPTED DOG OR CAT. THE CERTIFICATE SHALL

- 1 INCLUDE THE DATE OF ALTERATION, THE NAME OF THE OWNER OF THE DOG
- 2 OR CAT, THE DESCRIPTION OF THE DOG OR CAT, AND THE SIGNATURE OF
- 3 THE VETERINARIAN WHO PERFORMED THE ALTERATION.
- 4 (5) UPON CERTIFICATION BY A LICENSED VETERINARIAN IN WRITING
- 5 THAT AN ALTERATION POSES A SERIOUS MEDICAL OR HEALTH PROBLEM FOR
- 6 THE DOG OR CAT, A DOG OR CAT ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS ACT SHALL
- 7 NOT BE REQUIRED TO HAVE AN ALTERATION.
- 8 (6) A MUNICIPALITY, A HUMANE SOCIETY, OR A PRIVATE VETERI-
- 9 NARY CLINIC CONTRACTING WITH A MUNICIPALITY OR A HUMANE SOCIETY,
- 10 MAY ESTABLISH AND OPERATE A SPAY-NEUTER CLINIC.

- 12 breeds his OR HER own animals -, or to any person subject to the
- 13 provisions of Act No. 282 of the Public Acts of 1966, being sec
- 14 tions 287.361 to 287.375 of the Compiled Laws of 1948 IF THE
- 15 PERSON SELLS OR OTHERWISE TRANSFERS HIS OR HER OWN ANIMALS AND
- 16 DOES NOT ACT AS A DOG POUND OR ANIMAL SHELTER AS DEFINED IN
- 17 SECTION 1.
- 18 Sec. 10. (1) Any EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN
- 19 SUBSECTIONS (2) AND (3), A person who violates the provisions
- 20 of this act or any A rule of the department of agriculture
- 21 promulgated under the provisions of this act is guilty of a
- 22 misdemeanor.
- 23 (2) A DOG POUND OR ANIMAL SHELTER THAT VIOLATES
- 24 SECTION 8A(1) IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$500.00
- 25 OR MORE THAN \$1,000.00.
- 26 (3) A PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A CONTRACT FOR THE
- 27 ALTERATION OF A DOG OR CAT ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO SECTION 8A IS

- 1 SUBJECT TO A CIVIL FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$100.00 AND NOT MORE
- 2 THAN \$500.00. A PERSON WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A CONTRACT FOR
- 3 THE ALTERATION OF A DOG OR CAT ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO SECTION
- 4 8A WHO HAS ON A PREVIOUS OCCASION FAILED TO COMPLY WITH A CON-
- 5 TRACT FOR THE ALTERATION OF A DOG OR CAT ENTERED INTO PURSUANT TO
- 6 SECTION 8A IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$300.00
- 7 AND NOT MORE THAN \$500.00. IF A PERSON FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A
- 8 CONTRACT FOR THE ALTERATION OF A DOG OR CAT AS DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 9 SUBSECTION, A COURT WITH APPROPRIATE JURISDICTION MAY ORDER THE
- 10 TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF THE ADOPTED ANIMAL TO THE FACILITY FROM
- 11 WHICH THE ANIMAL WAS ADOPTED, OR TO A HUMANE SOCIETY, AN ANIMAL
- 12 CONTROL AGENCY, OR A LICENSED VETERINARIAN.
