February 1, 1989, Introduced by Senator FESSLER and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Veterans.

A bill to amend section 5 of Act No. 181 of the Public Acts of 1951, entitled

"An act to provide police protection for townships and for certain areas in townships; to authorize the purchase of police motor vehicles, apparatus and equipment, and the maintenance and operation thereof; to provide for defraying the cost thereof; to authorize the creation of special assessment districts, and for the levying and collection of special assessments,"

being section 41.855 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:
