A bill to amend sections 758, 759, and 769 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

section 759 as amended by Act No. 201 of the Public Acts of 1982, being sections 168.758, 168.759, and 168.769 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Sections 758, 759, and 769 of Act No. 116 of the
- 2 Public Acts of 1954, section 759 as amended by Act No. 201 of the
- 3 Public Acts of 1982, being sections 168.758, 168.759, and 168.769
- 4 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 758. -(1) For the purposes of this act, "absent voter"
- 6 means a qualified and registered elector:
- 7 (a) Who, on account of physical disability, cannot without
- 8 another's assistance attend the polls on the day of an election.

- 1 (b) Who, on account of the tenets of his religion, cannot
- 2 attend the polls on the day of election.
- 3 (c) Who cannot attend the polls on the day of an election in
- 4 the precinct in which he resides because of being an election
- 5 precinct inspector in another precinct.
- 6 (d) Who is 60 years of age or more.
- 7 (e) Who is absent or expects to be absent from the township
- 8 or city in which he or she resides during the entire period the
- 9 polls are open for voting on the day of an election.
- 10 (f) Who cannot attend the polls on election day because of
- 11 being confined in jail awaiting arraignment or trial.
- 12 (2) Subsection (1) shall not be applicable to FOR THE PUR-
- 13 POSES OF THIS ACT, "ABSENT VOTER" MEANS A QUALIFIED AND REGIS-
- 14 TERED ELECTOR. ABSENT VOTER DOES NOT INCLUDE a person who has
- 15 moved MOVES to another state, regardless of length of residence
- 16 therein IN THAT STATE, and who no longer maintains an actual
- 17 A residence in Michigan. The storage of personal effects or
- 18 household goods, the ownership of property which THAT is rented
- 19 or leased to others, or occasional brief visits to a former
- 20 Michigan domicile while residing elsewhere for most of the year
- 21 -shall DO not constitute a residence for voting purposes in this
- 22 state, except as defined in section 1 of article -2 II of the
- 23 state constitution of 1963 and statutes enacted thereunder.
- 24 UNDER THAT SECTION and except IN THE CASE OF former residents of
- 25 Michigan domiciled in the District of Columbia or to former
- 26 residents who are serving in the United States army, navy,
- 27 merchant marine, marine corps, or air force.

- 1 Sec. 759. (1) At-any-time during DURING the 75 days
- 2 preceding a primary or special primary, but not later than 2
- 3 p.m. of the Saturday immediately before the primary or special
- 4 primary, a voter AN ELECTOR who qualifies to vote as an absent
- 5 voter, as defined in section 758, may apply to the township,
- 6 city, or village clerk, either in person or by mail, to vote
- 7 absentee. An application received before a primary or special
- 8 primary may be for either that primary only or —for—that
- 9 primary and the election which follows.
- 10 (2) At any time during DURING the 75 days preceding any
- 11 other AN election OTHER THAN A PRIMARY OR SPECIAL PRIMARY, but
- 12 not later than 2 p.m. of the Saturday before the election, -a
- 13 voter AN ELECTOR who qualifies to vote as an absent voter, as
- 14 defined in section 758, may apply to the township, city, or vil-
- 15 lage clerk, either in person or by mail, to vote absentee.
- 16 (3) An application under this section may be made in any of
- 17 the following ways:
- 18 (a) By a written request signed by the -voter stating the
- 19 statutory grounds for making the application ELECTOR.
- 20 (b) On an application form provided for that purpose by the
- 21 clerk of the city, township, or village.
- (c) On a federal postcard application.
- 23 (4) The clerk of the city, township, or village shall have
- 24 application forms available in the office of the clerk -at all
- 25 times and shall furnish an application form to anyone upon a
- 26 verbal or written request. The application shall be in

- 1 substantially the following form and shall be signed by the 2 applicant: "Application for absent voter's ballot for: 3 [] The primary or special primary election to be held 4 5 on , 19... . [] The election to be held on, 19.... 6 7 (Check applicable election or elections) I, , a duly qualified and registered elector of 9 the precinct of the township of or village 10 of or of the ward of the city 11 of , in the county of and state of 12 Michigan, make application APPLY for an official ballot, or 13 ballots, to be voted by me at the election or elections as 14 requested in this application. 15 The statutory grounds on which I base my request are: 16 [] I expect to be absent from the community in which I am 17 registered for the entire time the polls are open on election 18 day. 19 [] I am physically unable to attend the polls without the 20 assistance of another. 21 [] I cannot attend the polls because of the tenets of my 22 religion.
- 23 [] I have been appointed an election precinct inspector in a
 24 precinct other than the precinct where I reside.

22 for an absent voter's ballot is guilty of a misdemeanor.
      Sec. 769. (1) The provisions of this chapter shall not be

27 official primary AN election, notwithstanding that he may have
