SENATE BILL No. 579

October 10, 1989, Introduced by Senators SCHWARZ, EHLERS and CARL and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend section 5133 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled as amended

"Public health code,"

as added by Act No. 488 of the Public Acts of 1988, being section 333.5133 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 5133 of Act No. 368 of the Public Acts
- 2 of 1978, as added by Act No. 488 of the Public Acts of 1988,
- 3 being section 333.5133 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 5133. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this sec-
- 6 tion, a physician who orders an HIV test or a health facility
- 7 that performs an HIV test shall provide counseling appropriate to
- 8 the test subject both before and after the test is administered.

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- 1 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this part, a physician,
- 2 or an individual to whom the physician has delegated authority to
- 3 perform a selected act, task, or function under section 16215,
- 4 shall not order an HIV test for the purpose of diagnosing HIV
- 5 infection without first receiving the written, informed consent
- 6 of the test subject. Subject to subsection (2), for FOR pur-
- 7 poses of this -subsection SECTION, written, informed consent
- 8 -shall consist CONSISTS of a signed writing executed by the
- 9 subject of a test or the legally authorized representative of the
- 10 test subject which includes, at a minimum, all of the following:
- (a) An explanation of the test including, but not limited
- 12 to, the purpose of the test, the potential uses and limitations
- 13 of the test, and the meaning of test results.
- (b) An explanation of the rights of the test subject includ-
- 15 ing, but not limited to, all of the following:
- 16 (i) The right to withdraw consent to the test at any time
- 17 before the administration of the test.
- 18 (ii) The right under this part to confidentiality of the
- 19 test results.
- 20 (iii) The right under this part to consent to and partici-
- 21 pate in the test on an anonymous basis.
- 22 (c) A description of the THE person OR CLASS OF PERSONS to
- 23 whom the test results may be disclosed UNDER THIS PART.
- 24 (3) Within 120 days after the effective date of this part
- 25 BY JULY 28, 1989, a physician or an individual to whom the physi-
- 26 cian has delegated authority to perform a selected act, task, or
- 27 function under section 16215 who orders an HIV test shall

- 1 distribute to the test subject -information A PAMPHLET regarding
- 2 the HIV test on a form provided by the department. The form
- 3 PAMPHLET shall be developed by the department and shall include
- 4 all of the following:
- 5 (a) The purpose and nature of the test.
- 6 (b) The consequences of both taking and not taking the 7 test.
- 8 (c) The meaning of the test results.
- 9 (d) Other information considered necessary or relevant by 10 the department.
- 11 (e) A -standard MODEL consent form for the signed writing
- 12 required under subsection -(1)- (2). The -standard MODEL con-
- 13 sent form shall include all of the information required under
- 14 subsection (2)(a), (b), and (c).
- 15 (4) The -form PAMPHLET required under subsection -(2) (3)
- 16 shall be made available to physicians through the department, the
- 17 Michigan board of medicine, and the Michigan board of osteopathic
- 18 medicine and surgery. The Michigan board of medicine and the
- 19 Michigan board of osteopathic medicine and surgery shall notify
- 20 in writing all physicians subject to this section of the require-
- 21 ments of this section and the availability of the form within
- 22 100 days after the effective date of this part BY JULY 10,
- 23 1989. Upon request, the Michigan board of medicine and the
- 24 Michigan board of osteopathic medicine and surgery shall provide
- 25 copies of the form, free of charge, to a physician who is subject
- 26 to this section.

- 1 (5) If a test subject is given a copy of the form PAMPHLET
- 2 required under subsection (3), a form, signed by the test
- 3 subject, indicating that he or she has been given a copy of the
- 4 form required under subsection (3) PAMPHLET, shall be included
- 5 in the test subject's medical record.
- 6 (6) A test subject who executes a signed writing pursuant to
- 7 subsection (2) -shall be IS barred from subsequently bringing a
- 8 civil action based on failure to obtain informed consent against
- 9 the physician who ordered the HIV test.
- 10 (7) The -information form PAMPHLET required by subsection
- 11 (2) (3) shall be provided by the department. The department
- 12 shall develop the form PAMPHLET and have the form IT ready
- 13 for distribution within 90 days after the effective date of this
- 14 part BY JUNE 28, 1989. The form PAMPHLET shall be written in
- 15 English and in clear, nontechnical terms. Copies of the form
- 16 PAMPHLET shall also be printed in Spanish. The -form- PAMPHLET
- 17 shall be distributed, upon request and free of charge, to a phy-
- 18 sician or other person or a governmental entity that is subject
- 19 to this section.
- 20 (8) In addition to the -forms PAMPHLETS provided under
- 21 subsection (7), the department shall provide copies of the -form-
- 22 PAMPHLET to the Michigan board of medicine and the Michigan board
- 23 of osteopathic medicine and surgery. The department shall pro-
- 24 vide copies of the -form- PAMPHLET to other persons upon written
- 25 request, at cost, and shall also provide copies of the form-
- 26 PAMPHLET free of charge, upon request, to public or private
- 27 schools, colleges, and universities.

- 1 (9) An individual who undergoes an HIV test at a department
- 2 approved testing site may request that the HIV test be performed
- 3 on an anonymous basis. If an individual requests that the HIV
- 4 test be performed on an anonymous basis, the HIV test shall be
- 5 administered anonymously or under the condition that the test
- 6 subject not be identified, and consent to the test shall be given
- 7 using a coded system that does not link the individual's identity
- 8 with the request for the HIV test or the HIV test results. If
- 9 the test results of an HIV test performed under this subsection
- 10 indicate that the test subject is HIV infected, the staff of the
- 11 department approved testing site shall proceed with partner noti-
- 12 fication in the same manner in which a local health department
- 13 would proceed as described in section 5114a(4)(a) and (b)
- 14 SECTION 5114A(3) TO (5).
- 15 (10) Subsection (2) does not apply to an HIV test performed.
- 16 for the purpose of research, if the test is performed in such a
- 17 manner that the identity of the test subject is not revealed to
- 18 the researcher and the test results are not made known to the
- 19 test subject.
- 20 -(11) A health facility may develop a standard protocol for
- 21 an HIV test performed upon a patient in the health facility in
- 22 preparation for an incisive or invasive surgical procedure.
- 23 (11) -(+2) This section does not apply to an HIV test per-
- 24 formed upon a patient in a health facility if both of the
- 25 -following conditions IN SUBDIVISIONS (A) AND (B) OR SUBDIVI-
- 26 SIONS (A) AND (C) are met:

- 1 (a) The patient is informed in writing upon admission to the
- 2 health facility that an HIV test may be performed upon the
- 3 patient without the written consent required under this section
- 4 under circumstances described in subdivision (b) OR (C).
- 5 (b) The HIV test is performed after a health professional or
- 6 other health facility employee sustains a percutaneous, mucous
- 7 membrane, or open wound exposure to the blood or other body
- 8 fluids of the patient.
- 9 (C) THE HIV TEST IS PERFORMED IN PREPARATION FOR AN INCISIVE
- 10 OR INVASIVE PROCEDURE AND IF THE PHYSICIAN IN CHARGE OF THE PRO-
- 11 CEDURE DETERMINES THAT THE PHYSICIAN OR ANOTHER HEALTH PROFES-
- 12 SIONAL TAKING PART IN THE PROCEDURE IS AT SIGNIFICANT RISK OF
- 13 EXPOSURE TO HIV DURING THE PROCEDURE.
- 14 (12) -(13) Subsections (2) and (3) do not apply if the test
- 15 subject is unable to receive or understand, or both, the
- 16 -information PAMPHLET required under subsection (3) or to exe-
- 17 cute the written consent -form required under subsection (2),
- 18 and the legally authorized representative of the test subject is
- 19 not readily available to receive the -information- PAMPHLET or
- 20 execute the written consent -form for the test subject.
- 21 (13) -(14) If the results of an HIV test performed -as
- 22 described in PURSUANT TO subsection (11) or (12) indicate that
- 23 the patient is HIV infected, the health facility shall inform the
- 24 patient of the positive test results and provide the patient with
- 25 appropriate counseling regarding HIV infection, acquired immuno-
- 26 deficiency syndrome, and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome
- 27 related complex.
