SENATE BILL No. 713

December 5, 1989, Introduced by Senators IRWIN and EHLERS and referred to the Committee on Economic Development.

A bill to amend section 51 of Act No. 327 of the Public Acts of 1945, entitled as amended

"Aeronautics code of the state of Michigan," as amended by Act No. 385 of the Public Acts of 1982, being section 259.51 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 51 of Act No. 327 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1945, as amended by Act No. 385 of the Public Acts of 1982, being
- 3 section 259.51 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
- 4 as follows:
- 5 Sec. 51. (1) The commission has general supervision over
- 6 aeronautics within this state. -It- THE COMMISSION shall encour-
- 7 age, foster, and participate with and grant state money to the
- 8 political subdivisions of this state in the development of
- 9 aeronautics within this state. -It- THE COMMISSION shall

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- 1 establish and encourage the establishment of airports, landing
- 2 fields, and other aeronautical facilities.
 It shall promulgate
- 3 rules pursuant to Act No. -306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as
- 4 amended, being sections 24.201 to 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled
- 5 Laws, it deems necessary and advisable for the public safety gov-
- 6 erning the designing, laying out, location, building, equipping,
- 7 and operation of airports and landing fields. The commission is
- 8 empowered to MAY establish programs of grant assistance and par-
- 9 ticipation with political subdivisions and agencies of this state
- 10 as the commission determines is necessary to carry out this act.
- 11 -It- THE COMMISSION shall not grant an exclusive right for the
- 12 use of an aeronautical facility. The commission, -may by the
- 13 issuance PROMULGATION of appropriate and effective rules,
- 14 -thereon- MAY register pilot's certificates issued by the civil
- 15 aeronautics authority or other similar federal authority to resi-
- 16 dent pilots of the state for which it may charge a fee OF not -to
- 17 exceed MORE THAN \$5.00; govern and regulate commercial opera-
- 18 tions in intrastate commerce for which it may charge a fee of not
- 19 more than \$25.00; and provide for the licensing of aircraft manu-
- 20 facturers and dealers for which it may charge a fee of not more
- 21 than \$25.00.
- 22 (2) The commission shall cooperate with and assist the fed-
- 23 eral government, state governments, authorities of political sub-
- 24 divisions, and individuals engaged in aeronautics or the develop-
- 25 ment of aeronautics, and shall seek to coordinate the aeronauti-
- 26 cal activities of these bodies. The commission may confer with
- 27 or hold joint hearings with any federal or state governments,

- 1 their agencies, the authorities of political subdivisions, and
- 2 individuals in connection with any matter arising under this
- 3 act, and avail itself of the cooperation, services, records, and
- 4 facilities of those agencies in the administration and enforce-
- 5 ment of this act. It THE COMMISSION shall reciprocate by fur-
- 6 nishing governments and their agencies its cooperation, services,
- 7 records, and facilities, insofar as may be practicable.
- 8 (3) The commission may perform acts, issue and amend orders,
- 9 and make, promulgate, and amend reasonable general or special
- 10 rules and procedures, and establish minimum standards, consistent
- 11 with this act, which it -deems- CONSIDERS necessary to carry out
- 12 this act and to perform its duties under this act, all commensu-
- 13 rate with and for the purpose of protecting and insuring the gen-
- 14 eral public interest, health, welfare, and safety. The commis-
- 15 sion may adopt and enforce -the provisions of the currently
- 16 effective federal legislation governing aeronautics. The commis-
- 17 sion shall promulgate rules pursuant to THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCE-
- 18 DURES ACT OF 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as
- 19 amended, being sections 24.201 to 24.315 24.328 of the Michigan
- 20 Compiled Laws, TO IMPLEMENT THIS ACT. The commission may deviate
- 21 from or add to rules when necessary for the public safety and
- 22 for the safety of aircraft and airmen OR OPERATORS OF
- 23 AIRCRAFT within the state. A rule of the commission -shall- DOES
- 24 not apply to aeronautical facilities owned by the federal
- 25 government.
- 26 (4) For the safety of aircraft and -airmen- OPERATORS OF
- 27 AIRCRAFT within this state, the commission may designate,

- 1 establish, or modify a state airways system. -It- THE COMMISSION
- 2 may publish and distribute maps, charts, and information relating
- 3 to that system.
- 4 (5) FOR THE ENCOURAGEMENT AND FOSTERING OF AVIATION AND AVI-
- 5 ATION SAFETY WITHIN THIS STATE, THE COMMISSION MAY DO ALL OF THE
- 6 FOLLOWING:
- 7 (A) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT AVIATION EDUCATION AND TRAINING
- 8 PROGRAMS.
- 9 (B) PUBLISH AND DISTRIBUTE EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL RELATING TO
- 10 AVIATION.
- 11 (C) PROVIDE APPROPRIATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE IMPLE-
- 12 MENTATION OF THIS SUBSECTION.
- 13 (6) -(5) The commission, a commission member or employee,
- 14 the director, and -every- EACH state, county, and municipal offi-
- 15 cer charged with the enforcement of state and municipal laws
- 16 shall enforce and assist in the enforcement of this act, -and of-
- 17 rules issued pursuant to PROMULGATED UNDER this act, and -of-
- 18 all other laws of this state relating to aeronautics. In the aid
- 19 of enforcement, general police powers are conferred upon the com-
- 20 mission, each of its members, the director, and the officers and
- 21 employees of the commission designated by the commission to exer-
- 22 cise those powers. The commission -is-further authorized to MAY
- 23 ALSO enforce this act and THE rules promulgated -pursuant to-
- 24 UNDER this act by injunction in the circuit court. The prosecut-
- 25 ing attorney of the county in which an offense is committed shall
- 26 prosecute offenders against this act and other aeronautical laws
- 27 of this state, or any rule promulgated or order issued by the

- 1 commission. When a complaint is made before the recorder's court
- 2 in OF the city of Detroit, a municipal court in a city having
- 3 such a court, or the district court in the county, district, or
- 4 political subdivision in which venue is proper, that court may
- 5 take cognizance, hear, try, and determine -such- THESE matters
- 6 and pass sentence upon offenders in accordance with law.
- 7 (7) -(6)— The commission, a commission member, the director,
- 8 or an employee designated by the commission may hold investiga-
- 9 tions, inquiries, and hearings concerning matters covered by this
- 10 act, aircraft accidents, or orders and rules of the commission.
- 11 Each person designated may administer oaths and affirmations,
- 12 certify to official acts, issue subpoenas, and compel the
- 13 attendance and testimony of witnesses, and the production of
- 14 papers, books, and documents. In case of failure to comply with
- 15 a subpoena or order issued under -authority of this act, the
- 16 commission, or its authorized representative, may invoke the aid
- 17 of a court of general jurisdiction. The court may order the wit-
- 18 ness to comply with the requirements of the subpoena or order, or
- 19 to give evidence -touching- RELATING TO the matter in question.
- 20 Failure to obey the order of the court may be punished by the
- 21 court as contempt.
- 22 (8) -(7)— In order to facilitate investigations by the com-
- 23 mission in the interest of public safety and THE development of
- 24 aeronautics, the reports of investigations or hearings, or any
- 25 part of them, shall not be admitted in evidence or used for any
- 26 purpose in an action or proceeding growing out of a matter
- 27 referred to in the investigation, hearing, or report, except in

- 1 case of A criminal or other -proceedings PROCEEDING instituted
- 2 in behalf of the state under -the provisions of this act or any
- 3 other law of this state relating to aeronautics. A commissioner,
- 4 director, or an officer or employee of the commission shall not
- 5 be required to testify to facts ascertained in, or information
- 6 gained by reason of, his or her official capacity, or -be-
- 7 required to testify as an expert witness in an action or proceed-
- 8 ing involving an aircraft. Subject to -the foregoing-provisions-
- 9 THIS SUBSECTION, the commission may make available to appropriate
- 10 federal and state agencies information and material developed in
- 11 the course of its hearings and investigations.
- 12 (9) -(8) For -the purposes of executing its powers and
- 13 duties under this act, the commission, upon recommendations to
- 14 the state administrative board, may enter into necessary
- 15 contracts.
