A bill to amend section 9 of Act No. 180 of the Public Acts of 1981, entitled as amended

"Older Michiganians act,"

being section 400.589 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; and to add sections 9a and 9b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Section 1. Section 9 of Act No. 180 of the Public Acts of
- 2 1981, being section 400.589 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
- 3 amended and sections 9a and 9b are added to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 9. (1) An agency designated by the commission as an
- 5 area agency on aging may be any of the following:
- 6 (a) An established office on aging located within the region
- 7 to be served by an area agency on aging.
- 8 (b) An office or agency of a unit of local government
- 9 -which- THAT is designated for the purpose of serving as an area

- 1 agency on aging by the chief elected official of that unit of
- 2 government.
- 3 (c) An office or agency designated by the appropriate chief
- 4 elected officials of a combination of units of local government.
- 5 (d) A public or nonprofit private agency, except a regional
- 6 or local agency of the state, -which THAT is under the supervi-
- 7 sion or direction of the state agency.
- 8 (2) An area agency on aging designated by the commission is
- 9 authorized to carry out the following duties and powers:
- 10 (a) Serve as an advocate for aging and older persons by rep-
- 11 resenting their interests to public officials and public and pri-
- 12 vate organizations within the planning and service area.
- 13 (b) Develop and administer an area plan for a comprehensive
- 14 and coordinated service delivery system in the planning and serv-
- 15 ice area, providing opportunities for older persons and service
- 16 providers to express their views to the area agency on policy
- 17 development and program implementation under the plan.
- 18 (c) Assess the kinds and levels of service needed by older
- 19 persons in the planning and service area, and the effectiveness
- 20 of other public and private programs serving those needs.
- 21 (d) Enter into subcontracts with local organizations for the
- 22 direct provision of services to meet the priority needs of older
- 23 persons identified in the plan.
- (e) Coordinate and assist regional or local public and non-
- 25 profit agencies in the planning and development of programs to
- 26 establish an areawide network of comprehensive, coordinated
- 27 service and opportunities for older persons.

- 1 (f) Serve as an advocate for aging and older persons by
- 2 assisting them in obtaining the benefits currently available
- 3 under federal and state law and by representing their interests
- 4 to public officials and public and private organizations within
- 5 the planning and serving area.
- 6 (q) Receive information from the office and commission
- 7 regarding legislation, regulation, and program and policy direc-
- 8 tion, and serve as the clearinghouse for dissemination of infor-
- 9 mation from and to older persons and service providers within the
- 10 planning and service area.
- 11 (h) Give priority in planning and administering services and
- 12 programs to those older persons with the greatest economic and
- 13 social need.
- 14 (i) Undertake other activities necessary to develop and
- 15 administer the area plan in compliance with the policies, guide-
- 16 lines, or rules as set forth by federal or state statute and reg-
- 17 ulation, the commission, and the office.
- 18 (j) Provide adequate and effective opportunities for older
- 19 persons to express their views on policy development and program
- 20 implementation.
- 21 (3) AN AREA AGENCY ON AGING DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSION
- 22 SHALL USE FUNDS DISTRIBUTED FROM THE SENIOR CARE RESPITE FUND
- 23 CREATED IN SECTION 9A TO PROVIDE DAY CARE FOR OLDER PERSONS OR
- 24 OTHER TYPES OF RESPITE SERVICES FOR PERSONS PROVIDING CARE TO
- 25 OLDER PERSONS. THE AREA AGENCY ON AGING MAY DEVELOP NEW PROGRAMS
- 26 OR FUND EXISTING PROGRAMS. EXCEPT WHERE A WAIVER ALLOWING DIRECT
- 27 SERVICE DELIVERY IS GRANTED BY THE OFFICE, THE AREA AGENCY ON

- 1 AGING SHALL AWARD THE DISTRIBUTED FUNDS BY GRANT OR CONTRACT TO
- 2 COMMUNITY AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS FOR THE PROVISION OF RESPITE
- 3 SERVICES.
- 4 (4) -(3) Each area agency on aging shall have an advisory
- 5 council, 1/2 of the membership of which shall be 60 years of age
- 6 or older.
- 7 SEC. 9A. (1) THE SENIOR CARE RESPITE FUND IS CREATED IN THE
- 8 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY. THE FUND SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE
- 9 OFFICE AND SHALL BE EXPENDED ONLY AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 9B.
- 10 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT TO THE FUND ALL OF THE
- 11 FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) MONEY THAT DESCENDS TO THE STATE AS AN ESCHEAT PURSUANT
- 13 TO SECTION 403A OF THE NONPROFIT HEALTH CARE CORPORATION REFORM
- 14 ACT, ACT NO. 350 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1980, BEING SECTION
- 15 550.1403A OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS.
- 16 (B) MONEY RECEIVED AS A GIFT OR DONATION TO THE FUND.
- 17 (C) MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE AS PROVIDED BY LAW.
- 18 (3) ANY BALANCES IN THE FUND AT THE END OF ANY FISCAL YEAR
- 19 SHALL BE CARRIED OVER AS A PART OF THE FUND AND SHALL NOT REVERT
- 20 TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 21 SEC. 9B. (1) THE OFFICE SHALL ANNUALLY DISTRIBUTE THE MONEY
- 22 IN THE SENIOR CARE RESPITE FUND TO THE AREA AGENCIES ON AGING
- 23 ACCORDING TO A FORMULA DEVELOPED BY THE OFFICE PURSUANT TO RULES
- 24 PROMULGATED UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, ACT
- 25 NO. 306 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1969, BEING SECTIONS 24.201 TO
- 26 24.328 OF THE MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS, OR ACCORDING TO THE TERMS
- 27 AND CONDITIONS OF THE DONOR.

- 1 (2) ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS OF THE OFFICE FOR ADMINISTERING THE
- 2 SENIOR CARE RESPITE FUND SHALL BE PAID OUT OF THE FUND.

- 4 all of the following bills of the 85th Legislature are enacted
- 5 into law:
