

# SENATE BILL No. 234

## EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

March 7, 1989, Introduced by Senator HOLMES and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of military affairs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1990; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to provide for certain duties of the department of military affairs; and to provide for the preparation of certain reports.

### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1       Sec. 101. There is appropriated for the department of military affairs,  
2 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1990, from the funds identified as  
3 follows:

16       Sec. 201. (1) In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of article  
 17 IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending in this act is  
 18 \$13,821,500.00 and state spending to be paid to units of local government is as  
 19 follows:

20 Department of Military Affairs

23       (2) When it appears to the principal executive officer of each department  
 24 that state spending to local units of government will be less than the amount  
 25 that was projected to be expended for any quarter, the principal executive  
 26 officer shall immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the

1 department of management and budget, the senate and house appropriations  
2 committees, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.

3       Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized under  
4 this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards, offices, and  
5 programs for which an appropriation is made under this act are subject to the  
6 management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public Acts of 1984, being  
7 sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

8       Sec. 203. As used in this act:

9       (a) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.

10       (b) "FTE" means full-time equated.

11       Sec. 204. The department of military affairs is authorized to utilize a  
12 portion of the \$69,400.00 appropriated in section 101 for disbursing officers  
13 to provide incentive payments to national guard recruiters as long as this  
14 expenditure does not require a supplemental appropriation or transfer of  
15 appropriations to this account.

16       Sec. 205. (1) The \$2,749,300.00 appropriated in section 101 for grants to  
17 veterans service organizations shall be used only for salaries, wages, related  
18 personnel costs, training, and equipment for accredited veteran service  
19 advocacy officers and necessary support and managerial staff. Training shall  
20 be provided for service advocacy officers and shall be conducted by accredited  
21 advocacy officers.

22       (2) A congressionally chartered veterans service organization receiving a  
23 grant from the funds appropriated in section 101 shall file with the department  
24 of military affairs a certified accounting of expenditures of the funds  
25 appropriated for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1989, and of volunteer  
26 hours and services performed by the veterans service organization and its

1 support or auxiliary groups, and a detailed budget request for the fiscal year  
2 ending September 30, 1991. The department of military affairs shall submit  
3 information required under this section to the senate and house fiscal agencies  
4 and to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on military affairs  
5 with the budget request for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991.

6       (3) Automatic increases shall not be considered by the legislature for the  
7 fiscal year beginning October 1, 1990. It is the intent of the legislature  
8 that each congressionally chartered veterans service organization's budget for  
9 the fiscal year 1990-91 shall be judged individually based upon program  
10 effectiveness and efficiency established by the audit review board created in  
11 Act 301 of 1988.

12       Sec. 206. The amounts appropriated for utilities and that portion of  
13 contractual services, supplies, and materials used to pay for utility service  
14 to state facilities in section 101 may be expended in a manner consistent with  
15 the provisions of section 253 of the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of  
16 the Public Acts of 1984, being section 18.1253 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.
