

HOUSE BILL No. 4932

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September 30, 1999, Introduced by Reps. Kilpatrick, Rick Johnson, Kelly, Allen, Jelinek, Julian, Garcia, Kukuk, Garza and Bovin and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1963 PA 181, entitled

"Motor carrier safety act of 1963,"

by amending sections 7 and 7c (MCL 480.17 and 480.17c), section 7 as amended and section 7c as added by 1995 PA 265.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 7. (1) Except as provided in sections 7b, 7c, and 7d, any PERSON, driver, or operator who violates this act or a rule promulgated under this act, or <u>any</u> AN owner or user of <u>any</u> A bus, truck, truck tractor, or trailer, or certain other motor vehicles or <u>any</u> AN officer or agent of <u>any</u> AN individual, partnership, corporation, or association or their lessees or receivers appointed by <u>any</u> A court <u>which</u> THAT is the owner or user of <u>any</u> A vehicle, who requires or permits the driver or operator to operate or drive <u>any</u> A bus, truck, truck tractor, or trailer, or certain other motor vehicles in violation of this

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act or a rule promulgated under this act, is guilty of a
 misdemeanor PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$250.00 for
 each violation. <u>punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90</u>
 days or a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both.

5 (2) A peace officer or an officer of the motor carrier divi-6 sion of the department of state police, upon reasonable cause to 7 believe that a motor vehicle is being operated in violation of 8 this act or a rule promulgated <u>pursuant to</u> UNDER this act, may 9 stop the motor vehicle and inspect the motor vehicle. If a vio-10 lation is found, the officer may issue a notice to appear for 11 that violation. If a motor vehicle is inspected by breaking the 12 load seal, then the peace officer shall give to the driver a 13 signed receipt of inspection and the peace officer shall be 14 responsible for reapplying a Michigan department of transporta-15 tion seal.

Sec. 7c. (1) A driver or operator or an owner or user of any A bus, truck, truck tractor, or trailer, or certain other motor vehicles, or <u>any</u> AN officer or agent of an individual, partnership, corporation, or association, or their lessees or creceiver appointed by <u>any</u> A court that is the owner or user of <u>any</u> A vehicle, who requires or permits the driver or operator to operate or drive <u>any</u> A bus, truck, truck tractor, or trailer, or certain other motor vehicles, that violates this act or a rule promulgated under this act if the vehicle is transporting a package required to be marked or labeled under 49 C.F.R. parts 100 to 180, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine of not more

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1 than \$500.00 for each violation. -, or by imprisonment for not
2 more than 90 days, or both.

3 (2) Any AN officer, employee, owner, or agent of an indi4 vidual, partnership, corporation, or association, or their les5 sees or receiver appointed by any A court that is the owner or
6 user of any hazardous materials vehicle inspection or repair
7 facility that violates a section of this act, or a rule promul8 gated under this act, related to the transportation of hazardous
9 materials, is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable as prescribed in
10 this section.
