## **SENATE BILL No. 1393**

June 16, 2010, Introduced by Senators PATTERSON, PRUSI, KUIPERS, RICHARDVILLE, BIRKHOLZ, JANSEN, PAPPAGEORGE and HARDIMAN and referred to the Committee on Hunting, Fishing and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 43537 (MCL 324.43537), as amended by 2007 PA 60.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 43537. (1) A resident who is declared legally blind is eligible to purchase a senior restricted or senior all-species fishing license. The department may demand proof of blindness. The licensee, when fishing, shall possess proof of blindness and shall furnish the proof upon the request of a peace officer.
  - (2) A disabled veteran is eligible to purchase any senior hunting license described in section 43535 or any senior fishing license described in section 43536, or both.
    - (3) As a pilot project for 2007, there shall be a disabled

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- 1 veterans firearm deer season in at least 3 areas of this state,
- 2 including Marquette county and deer management units 053 and 064.
- 3 The disabled veterans firearm deer season shall correspond with the
- 4 youth firearm deer hunting days, if any, established by order of
- 5 the commission. A disabled veteran may take 1 deer during the
- 6 disabled veterans firearm deer season. A disabled veteran taking
- 7 deer during this season shall possess a current firearm deer
- 8 license, combination deer license, or antlerless deer license or a
- 9 deer management assistance permit authorizing the disabled veteran
- 10 to take a deer with a firearm and issued for the area or land upon
- 11 which the veteran is hunting. The same kind of deer may be taken
- 12 during the disabled veterans firearm deer season as during the
- 13 regular November firearm deer season. This subsection does not
- 14 limit the authority of the commission under section 40113a to
- 15 establish a special hunting season in any area of this state for
- 16 veterans with disabilities or other classes of individuals.
- 17 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A SPECIAL MILITARY DEER
- 18 HUNTING PROGRAM. THE PROGRAM SHALL ATTEMPT TO MATCH HOLDERS OF DEER
- 19 MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE PERMITS WITH QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS INTERESTED
- 20 IN TAKING DEER UPON THEIR RETURN FROM ACTIVE DUTY.
- 21 (5) (4)—The department may demand proof of eligibility under
- 22 subsection (2), or (3), OR (4). The licensee, when hunting or
- 23 taking aquatic species, as applicable, shall possess proof of his
- 24 or her eligibility under subsection (2), or (3), OR (4) and shall
- 25 furnish the proof upon the request of a peace officer.
- 26 (6) (5) The department shall process licenses issued under
- 27 subsection (2) in the same manner as licenses issued to senior

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- 1 citizens for purposes of receiving appropriations from the
- 2 legislature under section 43546.
- 3 (7) (6) As used in this section: , "disabled
- 4 (A) "DISABLED veteran" means either of the following:
- 5 (i) (a) A resident who has been determined by the United States
- 6 department of veterans affairs to be permanently and totally
- 7 disabled as a result of military service and entitled to veterans'
- 8 benefits at the 100% rate, for a disability other than blindness.
- 9 (ii)  $\frac{(b)}{(b)}$  A resident rated by the United States department of
- 10 veterans affairs as individually unemployable.
- 11 (B) "QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL" MEANS A RESIDENT THAT IS A MEMBER
- 12 OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES OR NATIONAL GUARD AND THAT WAS ON
- 13 ACTIVE DUTY OUTSIDE THIS STATE DURING THE REGULAR NOVEMBER FIREARM
- 14 DEER SEASON.
