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MINUTES

A meeting of the Senate Economic Development Committee was held on Thursday, September 20, 2012, at 12:00 p.m. in the Senate Hearing Room of the Boji Tower.

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 p.m.

Members Present: Senators Kowall (C), Hildenbrand, Nofs, Emmons, Hansen, and Smith
Members Excused: Senator Hunter

Senator Kowall called the meeting to order.

Senator Kowall announced the order of business:

- SB 1230 (Sen. Emmons) Mobile homes; parks; bond for cleanup of mobile home park; require posting by owner.
- SB 1291 (Sen. Hildenbrand) Occupations; alarm systems; regulation of internet protocol-enabled security, monitoring, and control services providers; provide for.
- SB 1292 (Sen. Hildenbrand) Occupations; alarm systems; wireless security, monitoring, and control services providers; exclude from private security business and security alarm act.

Senator Hildenbrand, supported by Senator Emmons, motioned that the committee adopt the minutes of September 13, 2012. Without objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous voice.

Senator Kowall placed before the committee Senate Bill 1230 (Sen. Emmons). Senator Emmons explained the bill to committee members and answered questions.
