### **COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES**

#### **April 25, 2012**

A meeting of the Senate Committee on Reforms, Restructuring and Reinventing was held on Wednesday, March 28, 2012, in rooms 402 and 403 of the Capitol at 8:30 a.m.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 8:33 a.m. He instructed the Clerk to call the roll. At that time, the following members were present; Chairman Jansen, Sen.(s) Colbeck, Casperson, Kowall, Robertson, Young and Warren, a quorum.

The Chairman entertained a motion by Sen. Colbeck, seconded by Sen. Jansen, to adopt the minutes of the March 28, 2012 committee meeting.
