"Michigan election law,"

by amending section 963 (MCL 168.963), as amended by 2005 PA 71.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 963. (1) Within 35 days after the filing of the recall 2 petition, the filing official with whom the recall petition is 3 filed shall make an official declaration of the sufficiency or insufficiency of the RECALL petition. If the recall petition is 4 5 determined to be insufficient, the filing official shall notify the 6 person or organization sponsoring the recall of the insufficiency of the petition. It is not necessary to give notification unless 7 8 the person or organization sponsoring the recall files with the 9 filing official a written notice of sponsorship and a mailing

2 (2) Immediately upon determining that the **RECALL** petition is sufficient, but not later than 35 days after the date of filing of 3 4 the **RECALL** petition, the county clerk with whom the **RECALL** petition 5 is filed shall call the special election to determine whether the electors will recall the officer whose recall is sought. The 6 election shall be held on the next regular election date that is 7 not less than 95 days after the date the **RECALL** petition is filed 8 AND SHALL BE HELD ON THE NEXT MAY REGULAR ELECTION DATE OR THE NEXT 9 NOVEMBER REGULAR ELECTION DATE, WHICHEVER OCCURS FIRST. 10

(3) If a RECALL petition is filed under section 959, the filing official with whom the RECALL petition is filed shall call the special election. The election shall be held on the next regular election date that is not less than 95 days after the DATE THE RECALL petition is filed AND SHALL BE HELD ON THE NEXT MAY REGULAR ELECTION DATE OR THE NEXT NOVEMBER REGULAR ELECTION DATE, WHICHEVER OCCURS FIRST.
