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HB 5508 – HB 5509

To date, the State Bar does not have a position on this matter.

HB 5508 (Zorn) Family law; child support; office of child support to develop an electronically accessible registry containing names of individuals with outstanding child support to intercept gambling winnings; establish. Amends sec. 3 of 1971 PA 174 (MCL 400.233).

HB 5509 (MacGregor) Gaming; casinos; distribution of casino winnings for child support arrearages; update to reflect payment to the state disbursement unit. Amends title & sec. 3 of 1996 IL 1 (MCL 432.203) & adds sec. 9e.

Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:

HBs 5508 and 5509 require the Office of Child Support to work with the Department of Treasury to create a secure registry of persons owing past due child support so that gaming casinos can intercept winnings in appropriate cases. 5509 sets up an objection process, so that the payer can contest the distribution of proceeds before they are released.

The Section supports these bills in concept.
