MINUTES

The Senate Committee on Transportation held a meeting on Tuesday, November 5, 2013 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 100 of the Farnum Building.

Senator Casperson called the meeting to order at 12:35 p.m.

Senator Casperson announced the following order of business:

- Adoption of the minutes from the October 29, 2013 meeting
- SB 463 Sen. Caswell Vehicles; registration plates; required attachment of registration plate to rear of vehicle; eliminate requirement for certain historic military vehicles.
- SB 491 Sen. Brandenburg Vehicles; registration; off-road vehicle eligibility for registration and certificate of title; modify to allow for off-road vehicles that may be modified for on-road use under certain circumstances.
- Presentation by Bridgeguard to provide members with an overview of the benefits that could be derived from utilizing new technology for the inspection and maintenance of bridges.

Senator Casperson led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Senator Kowall made a motion to adopt the minutes from the October 29, 2013 meeting; being no objection, the motion carried.

Senator Casperson announced Senate Bill 463 was the next order of business. He reminded members testimony had been taken at the previous meeting.
